### **Nominating Committee Report**

The full report of the Nominating Committee, chaired by Dan Ritchie, is being mailed to you. It can also be found on the Society's website. The highlights are as follows:

The Society currently has nine Directors. The positions of five of these Directors are up for election in 2008. One of these

five, Uma Lele, does not wish to serve another term, while the others have agreed to continue.

The Nominating Committee noted that there are significant gender imbalance resulting from the resignation of Connie Hope and Sununta Prasarnpranich, and Uma's decision to step down.

To fill the five positions on the Board of Directors, the Committee recommends the following slate:

For two-year positions: Victoria Elliott (as a new nominee) and Khalid Siraj (as an incumbent).

For the one-year positions the Committee recommends that the following incumbents be re-elected: Kunio Kikuchi, Carlos Escudero and Charles Ziegler.

### **RALC: Age-in-Place Panel Discussion**

On Thursday, November 20 from 2.00-4.30 pm in the J Building Auditorium (JB1- 080), RALC will hold an event on

*"Age-in-Place: There's No Place Like Home".*

In a recent survey, ninety percent of seniors in the Metropolitan area preferred to age in their homes rather than relocate to a retirement community. Age-in-Place programs, or Senior Villages, are being developed around the country as an innovative means to help neighbors age and thrive at home. Community organizers in the Metropolitan area are developing full-service concierge programs that provide members with anything from a ride to the doctors or the store, light house maintenance/gardening, to entertainment and exercise programs in the 'village'.

For this event, RALC has lined up an exciting panel of experts on aging to share their challenges and successes. The panel includes AARP (The American Association of Retired Persons), the Federal Agency on Aging, the National Council on Aging in Place (NAIPC) and the Executive Director of the area's only operating senior village, the Capitol Hill Village. Representatives from the approximately 10 local 'Aging in Place' villages and key aging-in-place service providers in the Metropolitan area have also been invited to provide information on their facilities and will be available to talk to members. 1818 Members, who are active in these villages, will also discuss their experiences.

### **PTF Seeks an Executive Manager**

The Partnership for Transparency Fund (PTF) is looking for a World Bank retiree to serve as its Executive Manager. PTF is a highly successful and innovative international NGO that provides small grants to civil society organizations (CSOs) willing to fight corruption and encourage transparency. The objective is to promote financial support and advice to CSOs willing to attack corruption directly. PTF has supported some 75 initiatives in over 35 countries. Until now PTF has been managed by experienced volunteers (e.g. Randolph Andersen, Steve Ettinger, Lars Jeurling, Pierre Landell-Mills, Mike Stevens, and Dan Ritchie). But with a new grant of £2 million sterling from DFID and permanent funding from

the World Bank’s DGF of \$400,000 per year, PTF is ramping up its activities significantly and hence needs an executive manager.

This is an ideal opportunity for a WB retiree interested in helping to manage this growing and very dynamic not-for-profit enterprise. The person selected would receive a modest stipend of around US\$30,000 per year. The person would work part time from home with highly flexible hours; the duties and responsibilities can be tailored to an individual’s specific interests and circumstances. This would be an ideal job for a retiree who is still active and interested in governance issues, who also has administrative skills and a good network of peers he or she might mobilise.

### **Artists’ & Writers’ Corner**

#### **John Cleave’s *Istanbul: City of Two Continents* published.**

A third coffee-table book by John Cleave, in his publisher’s *Sketchbook* series, is set to reach US bookstores in the next few weeks. This time his subject is Istanbul, formerly the capital of two empires and today the largest city in Turkey.

In his book, John, who turned to architectural photography on his retirement from the Bank, has captured both the landmarks of the historic center for which Istanbul is renowned and the lesser known and modern which are part of the essential 21st century city. As in his earlier works — *Washington: Scenes from a Capital City*, which was a Washington Post best-seller over Christmas 2003, and

*Athens: Scenes from a Capital City*, which appeared in 2005 — John's illustrations, water-color like in style but in fact computer-derived from his original images, are accompanied by his own annotations. Each of the book's four chapters is introduced by John Freely, a famed chronicler of the history and treasures of a city that has for so long been his home.
