a. World Bank Atlas methodology; per capita GNI (gross national income, formerly GNP) figures are in 2007 U.S. dollars.

b. Countries are eligible for IDA on the basis of (a) relative poverty and (b) lack of creditworthiness. The operational cutoff for IDA eligibility for fiscal 2009 is a 2007 GNI per capita of US\$1,095, using Atlas methodology. To receive IDA resources, countries must also meet tests of performance. In exceptional circumstances, IDA extends eligibility temporarily to countries that are above the operational cutoff and are undertaking major adjustment efforts but are not creditworthy for IBRD lending. An exception has been made for small island economies.

c. An exception to the GNI per capita operational cutoff for IDA eligibility (\$1,095 for fiscal 2009) has been made for some small island economies on the basis of their vulnerability.

d. Loans/credits in nonaccrual status as of June 30, 2008. When these countries reengage with IDA, a new debt sustainability analysis (DSA) will determine their grant eligibility status. General information on countries with loans/credits in nonaccrual status is available from the Credit Risk Department in Finance.

e. The GNI per capita has been above the operational cutoff for IDA eligibility (\$1,095 for fiscal 2009) for more than two consecutive years, therefore the borrower will be subject to IDA lending on hardened terms (10 years' grace period and a maturity of 20 years, with principal repayable at 10 percent per annum for years 11–20).

f. The GNI per capita has not been above the operational cutoff for IDA eligibility (\$1,095 for fiscal 2009) for more than two consecutive years; therefore, at this time, the borrower will still be subject to regular IDA terms.
