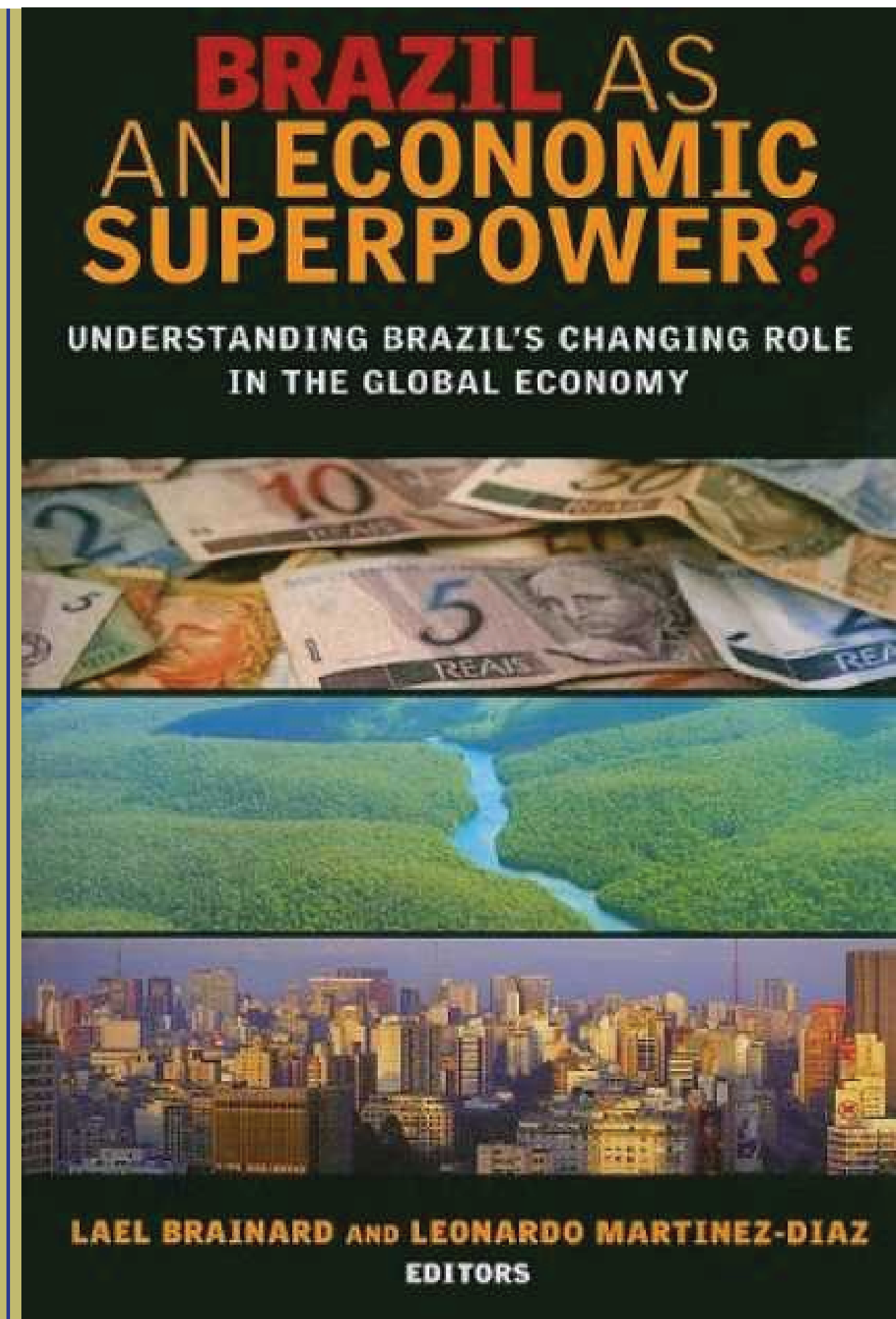


BRAZIL AS AN ECONOMIC SUPERPOWER?
