

# Reaching Out to Parents & Teachers in Peru

*Do You Know How Much Your Children Are Learning?*

Peru measures student learning outcomes through national standardized tests and reports the results publicly. To help communicate the purpose of testing and to garner support for the use of test results, the World Bank produced a film with Peru's Ministry of Education, which was recently launched in Peru with the participation of Alan Garcia, President of Peru. The film is a powerful tool to help parents, teachers and administrators understand student test results and use them to improve learning outcomes. This first U.S. screening will be followed by an expert round table, which will discuss how this tool can promote the sharing of test results for greater parental participation and accountability.
