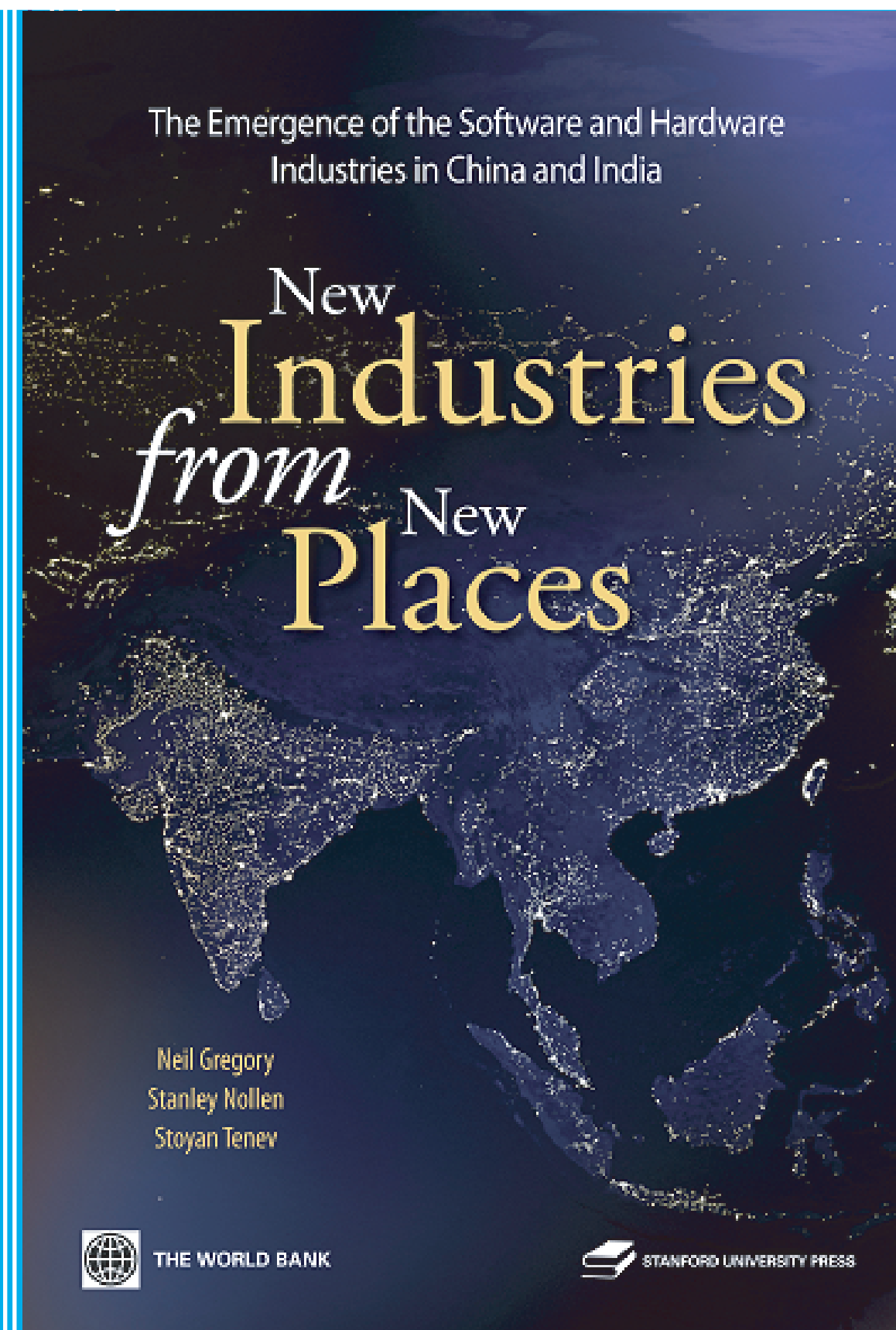


NEW INDUSTRIES FROM NEW PLACES
