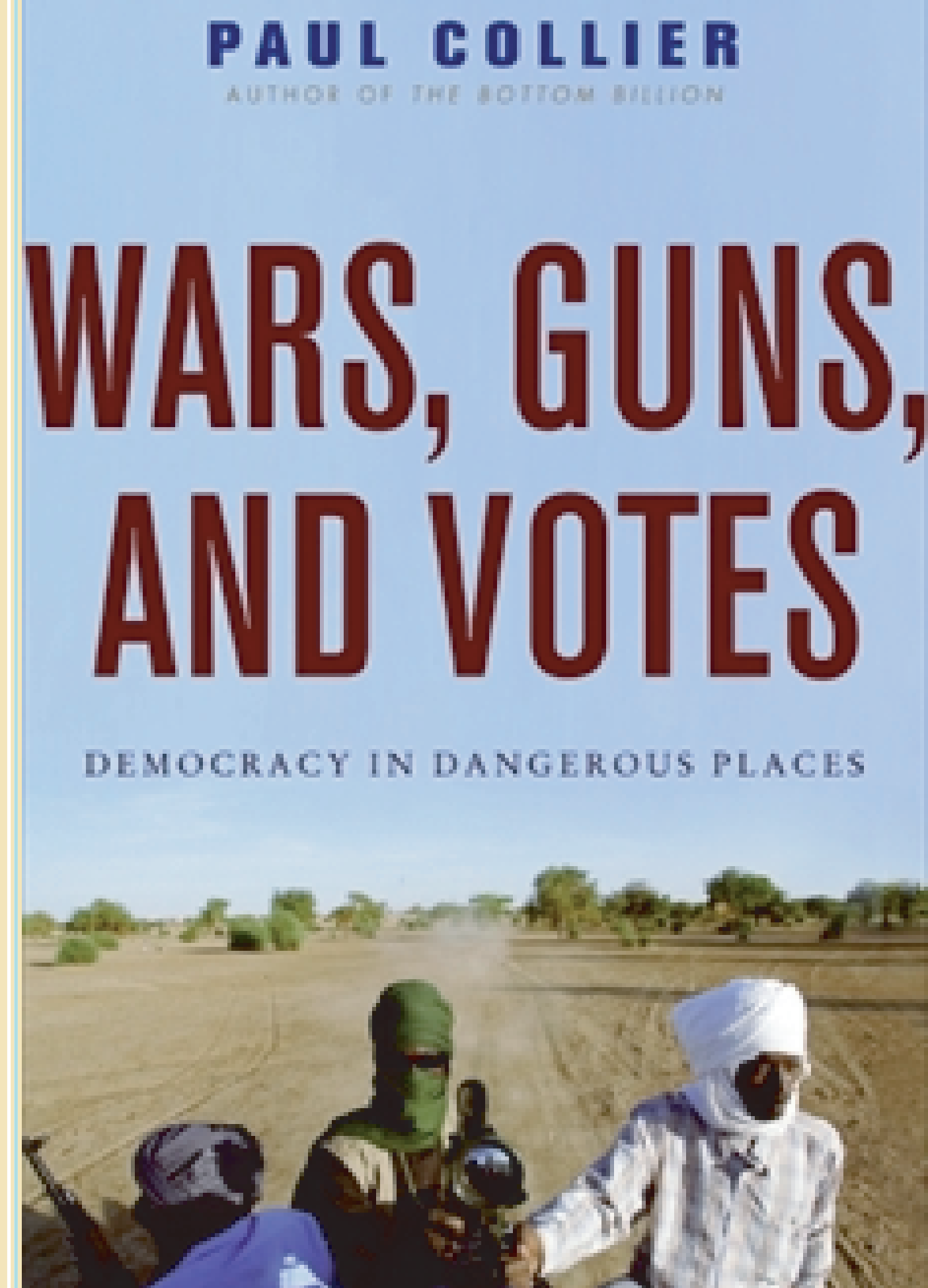


WARS, GUNS, AND VOTES DEMOCRACY IN DANGEROUS PLACES
