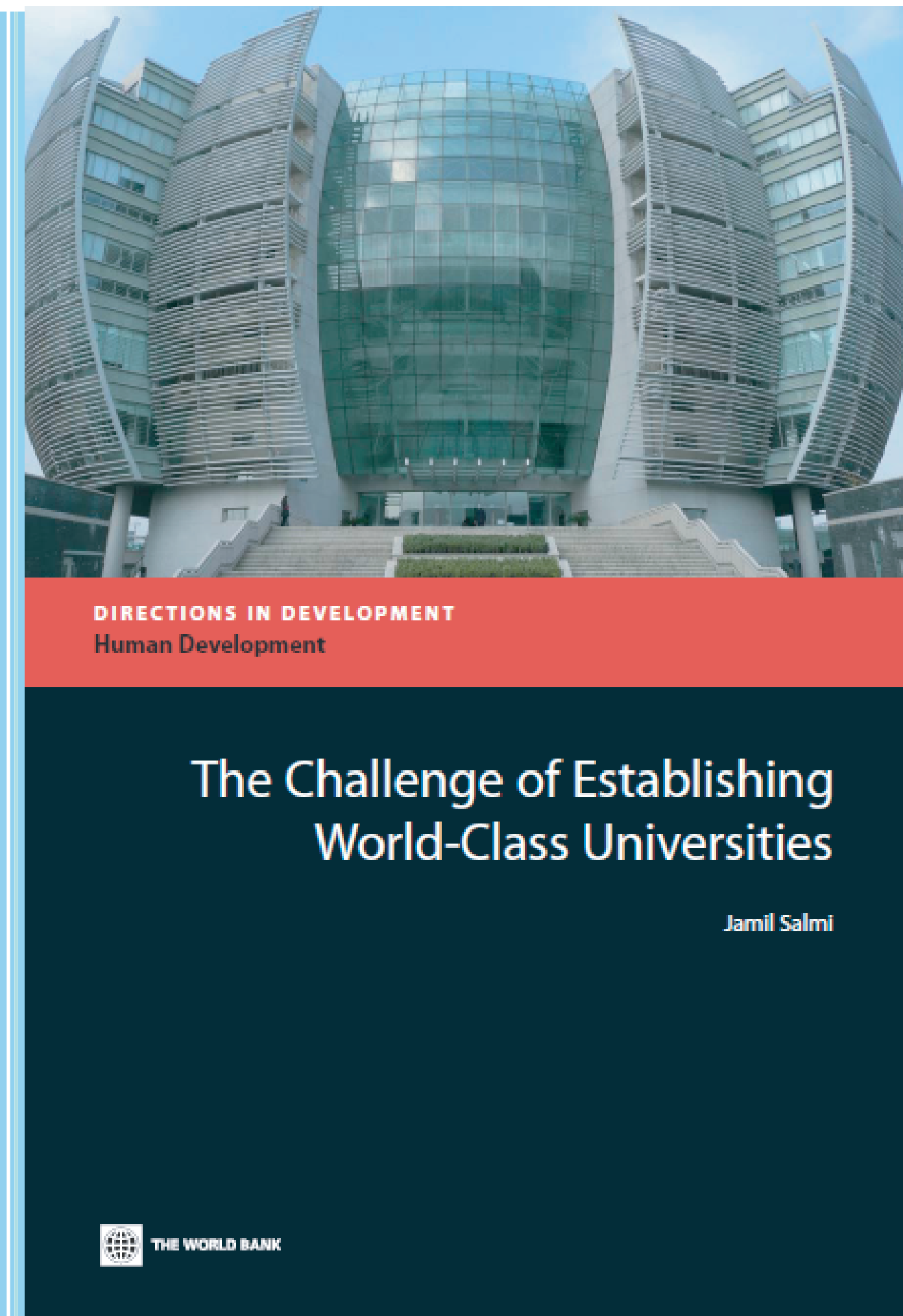


THE CHALLENGE OF ESTABLISHING WORLD-CLASS UNIVERSITIES
