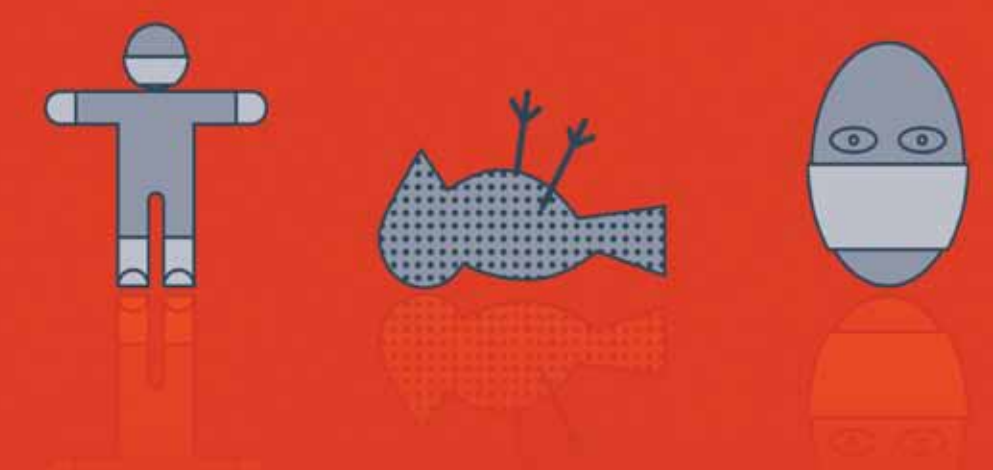
A Framework for Sustaining Momentum

There have been three major epidemiological events in the first decade of this century with significant political, economic and health consequences: Severe Acute Respiratory Syndrome (SARS), H5N1 Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza (HPAI) and Influenza Pandemic (H1N1). The emergence of newly infectious diseases that jump from the animal kingdom to the human population is likely to increase. Developing countries will be hardest hit. The 2010 United Nations and World Bank progress report is the fifth and most comprehensive in the series, and the first to take into account the 2009 pandemic.
