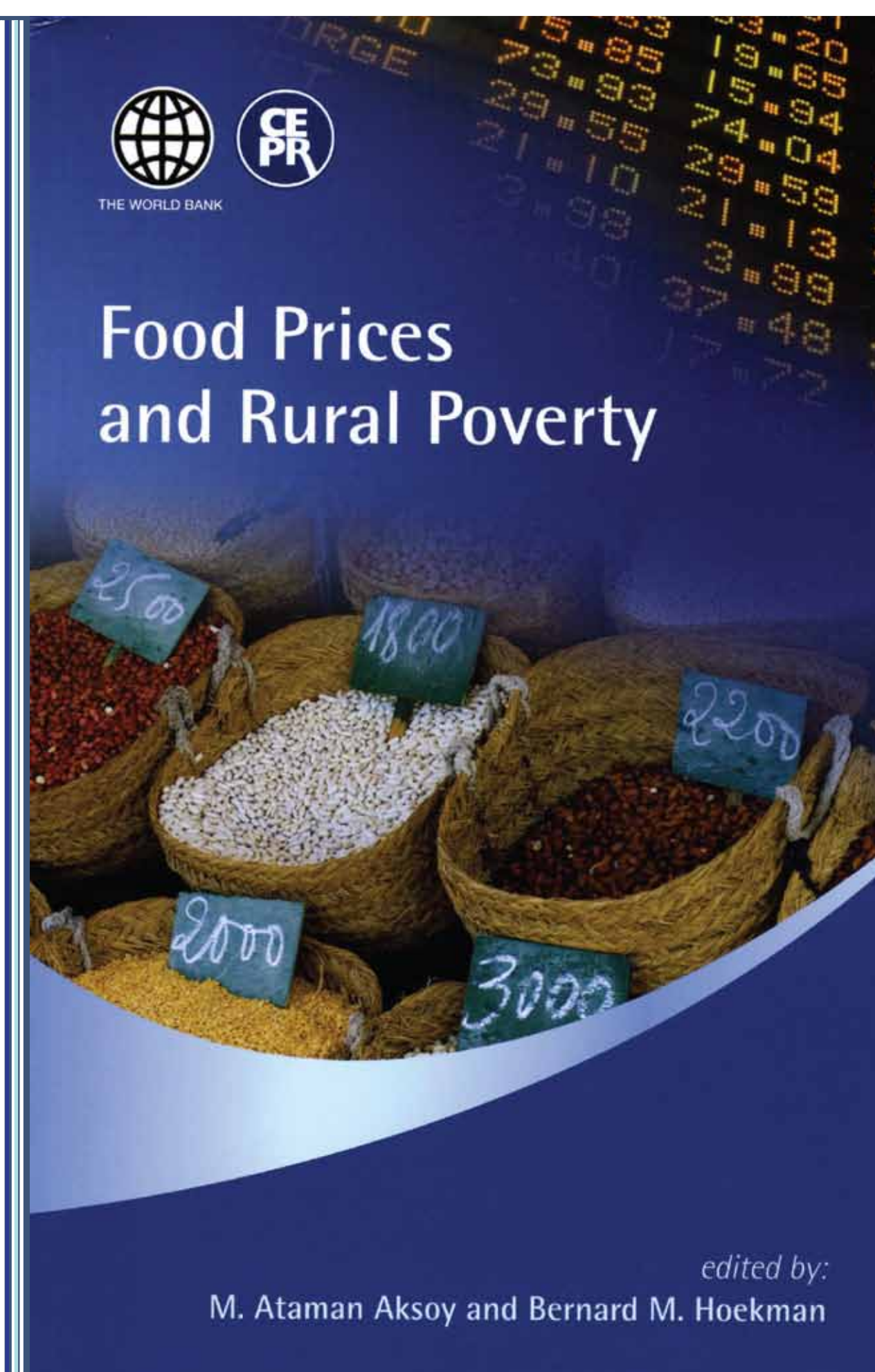


Food Prices & Rural Poverty
