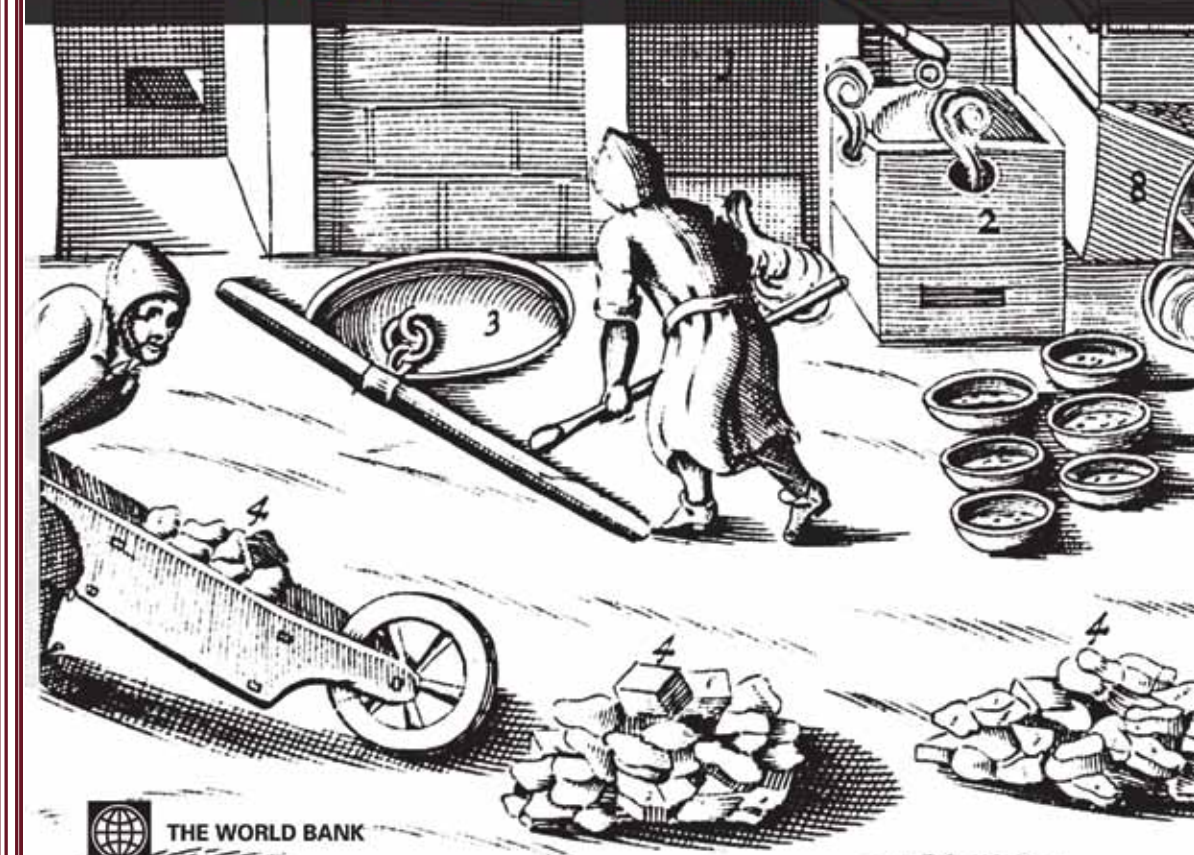
The Political Economy of Natural Resource-led Development
