

## **Job opening: Field Coordinator for Cote d'Ivoire HIV survey**

The Africa HIV/AIDS Impact Evaluation Program (AIM-AIDS) is looking for a Field Coordinator to support the implementation of a follow-up survey in Cote d'Ivoire. The data collection is planned for end-July 2012 and aims to reach 3,600 individuals in four regions that were part of the baseline survey, collected in April 2010.

Data collection will include surveys on sexual behavior, exposure to conflict and collection of HIV rapid tests. The study aims to study the impact that health clubs for HIV-negatives had on their sexual behavior and HIV status (this was the initial goal of the study, prior to the 2010-11 post-election conflict) and the effect that conflict had on similar indicators, especially among vulnerable groups.

The Field Coordinator will support the design, implementation, and analysis of the follow-up survey. The Field Coordinator should be based in the country on June 4th for at least 9 months. The Field Coordinator should have a graduate degree in economics, public health or public policy. Fluency in French and experience with survey work in Africa is highly desirable.
