Femi Oke is an international journalist, news host and the special correspondent for the syndicated American news show "The Takeaway". Femi became internationally known for her reporting on Africa after joining CNN International in 1999. She also hosted CNN's weekly award-winning African affairs program "Inside Africa". Her work has been recognised by ECOWAS, the African Communications Agency, InterAction, and the Peabody Awards Committee. Before re-locating to America Femi was a well-established broadcaster in the United Kingdom, where she produced award-winning television and reported and hosted news and current affairs, science, educational and entertainment programs.

She began her career at the age of fourteen, as a junior reporter for LBC Radio, the United Kingdom's first talk radio station. Femi continued to work for commercial radio during her time at school and university. The day after she graduated from Birmingham University with a Bachelor of Arts degree in English Literature and Language she joined the BBC as a radio researcher and reporter.

After more than a decade working in the British media Femi moved to America to anchor and report for CNN International. Originally hired to launch CNN's World Weather Service, she soon branched out from meteorology, reporting general news and feature stories with her special brand of energy and enthusiasm. During her nine years at CNN Femi traveled the world, broadcasting daily to an audience of more than 200 million viewers.

Femi has worked with the United Nations World Meteorological Organization to create television-training programs for meteorologists in South America and Southern Africa. Speaking, moderating and lecturing credits include the European Commission, the World Science Festival, World Expo 2011, the Africa-America Institute, the WFP, UNDP, UN HABITAT, UNICEF, UNESCO, UN WOMEN and the World Bank.

As well as her national radio commitments on "The Takeaway" Femi also files special reports for UNICEF Radio and the BBC. She is British by Birth, Nigerian by parentage and a New Yorker by zip code!



Sri Mulyani Indrawati

Managing Director - The World Bank

Sri Mulyani Indrawati is the managing director at the World Bank and responsible for the institution's operations in all regions. In addition she oversees other administrative vice-presidencies and functions, including the Integrity Vice Presidency, Sanctions Board Secretariat and the Office of Evaluation and Suspension.

Sri Mulyani joined the World Bank in June 2010. Previously she served as Indonesia's minister of finance in addition to being the coordinating minister of economic affairs. During that time she guided the economic policy for one of the largest countries in Southeast Asia, and one of the biggest states in the world, navigating successfully the global economic crisis, implementing key reforms, fighting corruption and earning the respect of her peers across the world. She is credited with helping to steer Indonesia through the challenging but successful transition from autocracy to democracy.

Ms. Indrawati led the Indonesian National Development Planning Agency prior to her position as finance minister. During that time she coordinated the government and international reconstruction effort following the devastating 2004 tsunami. Her earlier positions include, Executive Director at the International Monetary Fund, faculty member at the University of Indonesia and a visiting professor at the Andrew Young School of Public Policy at Georgia State University.

Ms. Indrawati holds a Ph.D. in Economics from the University of Illinois and a B.A. in Economics from the University of Indonesia. She has received numerous honors and awards, including Euromoney Magazine's Global Finance Minister of the Year, and Emerging Markets Best Finance Minister in Asia. She has also been regularly on Forbes List of the 100 Most Powerful Women in the world.

Ms. Indrawati is married with three children.

Mr. Purisima served in the government of the Republic of the Philippines as Secretary of the Department of Trade and Industry in 2004 and Secretary of the Department of Finance in 2005, and in July 1, 2010 he was reappointed as Department of Finance Secretary. He also served as Chair and Member of the Board of many government companies including National Power Corporation (NAPOCOR), Land Bank of the Philippines, and Monetary Board (Bangko Sentral ng Pilipinas).

He has extensive work experience in public accounting both here and abroad. Mr. Purisima was Area Managing Partner as head of the Asia Pacific Assurance Practice of Andersen Worldwide from 2001-2002 and was Regional Managing Partner as head of the Asean operation from 2000-2001. He was member of the Global Board of Andersen Worldwide from 1999-2002 and the Global Executive Board of Ernst & Young from 2002-2004.

He was Chairman & Managing Partner of SGV & Co. until January 2004. He has various memberships in several business organizations including the Management Association of the Philippines, Philippine Institute of Certified Public Accountants, Philippine-France Business Council, Philippine-Thailand Business Council and the Makati Business Club, among others.

Mr. Purisima obtained his Bachelor of Science in Commerce, Majors in Accounting & Management of Financial Institutions from De La Salle University (1979) and his MBA from JL Kellogg Graduate School of Management, Northwestern University in Chicago, Illinois (1983). In 1979, he was among the top placers in the Philippine Board Examinations for Certified Public Accountants.

Peter Y. Solmssen

*Member of the Managing Board and General Counsel
of Siemens AG*

Peter Solmssen is the first and only American to serve as a Member of the Managing Board of Siemens AG. He is responsible for the company's business in North and South America and is the company's General Counsel. Prior to joining Siemens, Solmssen was for five years Executive Vice President and General Counsel of GE Healthcare, one of the six operating units of General Electric Company, based in Chalfont St. Giles, UK. While at GE Healthcare he led an industry-wide compliance initiative that culminated in a new code of conduct for diagnostic imaging vendors. He joined GE in 1998 as Vice President and General Counsel of GE Plastics in Pittsfield, Massachusetts.

From 1989 to 1998, Solmssen was a senior partner in the law firm of Morgan, Lewis & Bockius LLP of Philadelphia. He was in charge of the firm's Frankfurt am Main office, specializing in M&A and securities law.

Solmssen started his career as an attorney at the law firm of Ballard, Spahr, Andrews & Ingersoll, in Philadelphia, from 1982 to 1989. Before that he served as a law clerk for U.S. Federal District Court Judge Clarence C. Newcomer, from 1980 to 1982.

Solmssen received his J.D., cum laude from the University of Pennsylvania in Philadelphia, where he was Articles Editor of the *University of Pennsylvania Law Review* and his A.B. magna cum laude from Harvard University. He also studied law at Brasenose College, Oxford University, U.K., on a Knox Fellowship.

Julio Rojas is the Chief Executive of Standard Chartered Bank in the Americas. Appointed in June 2011, Julio is responsible for all of the Bank's businesses in the Americas. Based in New York City, he leads the Americas senior management team and reports directly to the Chief Executive Office – Middle East, Africa, Europe and the Americas.

Julio has been with Standard Chartered Bank for over 24 years. Prior to his current role, Julio was the Acting Global Head, Financial Institutions from August 2010 to May 2011. In this role, he was responsible for all global Financial Institutions relationships, including Banks, Securities companies, Insurance, Funds and Development Organizations (Multilateral Organizations, Bi-lateral Organizations and NGO's). From 2003 to 2010, Julio was the Regional Head Financial Institutions, Americas. Prior to 2003, Julio held positions as the General Manager of Banco Standard Chartered (majority controlled subsidiary in Latin America) and Regional Head Financial Institutions, Europe based in London. Before joining Standard Chartered Bank, Julio worked at First Interstate Bank – California.

Julio is an executive board member of the Institute of International Bankers (IIB) and a board member of the Hong Kong Association of New York (HKANY). He is also a member of the Advisory Board at the University of Washington -Pacific Rim Bankers Program (PRBP).

Karan Bhatia

*Vice President & Senior Counsel
Global Government Affairs and Policy
General Electric Company*

Karan Bhatia serves as Vice President and Senior Counsel of Global Government Affairs and Policy for General Electric. In this role, he oversees GE's engagement on public policy issues with governments around the world, and works to expand the company's presence in global markets.

Before joining GE, Bhatia served as Deputy U.S. Trade Representative, a Presidential appointment with the rank of Ambassador, overseeing U.S. international trade policy with respect to Asia and Africa. Specific achievements include negotiating the landmark U.S.-Korea Free Trade Agreement, concluding the U.S.-Vietnam Bilateral WTO Accession Agreement, founding the U.S.-India Trade Policy Forum, and supervising the U.S.-China Joint Commission on Commerce and Trade. Additionally, Bhatia oversaw USTR's engagement in the areas of trade capacity building and international environmental and labor policy and served on the boards of the Overseas Private Investment Corporation and the Millennium Challenge Corporation.

Prior to joining the Office of the U.S. Trade Representative, Bhatia was Assistant Secretary for Aviation and International Affairs at the U.S. Department of Transportation from 2003-2005. In this role, he crafted U.S. international and domestic aviation policy, and supervised the negotiation of international air services agreements with more than 20 countries, including significant market liberalizing agreements with China and India.

Bhatia previously served in the Department of Commerce as Deputy Under Secretary and Chief Counsel for the Bureau of Industry and Security, the U.S. Government agency that administers U.S. export controls. Prior to his government service, he was a partner in the Washington, D.C. law firm Wilmer, Cutler & Pickering, where he was a member of the firm's international and corporate groups.

Bhatia has written and spoken widely on international trade and transportation policy, taught at Georgetown University Law Center, and testified on many occasions before Congress. He currently serves as Chairman of the Board of the National Center for APEC. He is also a member of the Trilateral Commission, and a member of the World Economic Forum's Global Agenda Council on the Global Trade System.

Bhatia holds a bachelor's degree from Princeton University, a master's from the London School of Economics, and a law degree from Columbia University. He is married to Sara Levine Bhatia and has two children.



Janamitra (Dev) Devan

Vice President and Head of Network, Financial and Private Sector Development, The World Bank International Finance Corporation (IFC)

Devan is World Bank–IFC vice president for Financial and Private Sector Development. As leader of the network, he engages with government policy makers who shape the business environment for the private sector. He works to promote collaborative public-private dialogue and the development of a regulatory environment that fosters opportunities for entrepreneurship and job creation.

Devan also provides intellectual leadership and strategic direction in the areas of financial sector diagnostics and policy advice to national financial sector regulatory and supervisory authorities to help build strong and efficient financial systems.

Since joining the World Bank Group in October 2009, Devan has focused on efforts to facilitate access to a broad range of financial services—for firms and for households—and to mobilize the private sector in offering better services to the poor, ranging from housing finance and insurance to microfinance and remittances. Devan also represents the World Bank on the Financial Stability Board in Basel.

Previously, Devan spent 10 years at McKinsey & Company, building extensive experience in Asia and North America. He served as director for Asia at McKinsey Global Institute and before that as director of global operations for McKinsey’s Strategy Practice.



Rashad-Ruldolf Kaldany
Vice President, Global Industries
International Finance Corporation

Rashad Kaldany is IFC's Vice President for Global Industries, and a member of the Management Team.

Prior to this assignment, Mr. Kaldany was Vice President, Asia, Eastern Europe, Middle East and North Africa, based in Istanbul. Previously, he was Vice President for Middle East and North Africa, and Global Infrastructure Cluster, which included the Infrastructure; Information and Communication Technologies; Oil, Gas, Mining, and Chemicals; and Subnational Finance departments.

Mr. Kaldany joined IFC in 1988 as an Investment Officer in the West Africa and Middle East Department and transferred to the Middle East and North Africa Department in 1990. From 1992 to 1994, he was Special Assistant to IFC's Executive Vice Presidents, Sir William Ryrie and Mr. Jannik Lindbaek. In 1994 he became Manager, Capital Markets Division, of the Asia Department. In 1997, he was promoted to Director, South and Southeast Asia Department, and was based in New Delhi, India.

Mr. Kaldany returned to headquarters in 2000 as the Director of the Oil, Gas, and Chemicals Department, a joint IFC-World Bank department, which merged with the Mining Department in July 2002. He oversaw the multi-stakeholder extractive industries consultation process, which reinvigorated the mandate for World Bank Group activities in these sectors, with a focus on community development. He also led the Bank Group's participation in launching the Extractive Industries Transparency Initiative and the Global Gas Flaring Reduction Partnership.

From March 2007 until June 2008, Mr. Kaldany was Director of the Infrastructure Department. During this time, IFC's activities in infrastructure development more than doubled.

Mr. Kaldany received a Ph.D. from Columbia University and an MBA from Stanford University.

Mr. Mohieldin is a World Bank Managing Director, responsible for the Bank's knowledge development as represented through the Networks: Finance and Private Sector Development; Sustainable Development; Poverty Reduction and Economic Management; and Human Development; and the World Bank Institute. As the World Bank's representative at the G20 Deputies Meetings, he also oversees the Bank's work in support of the G20 agenda.

Prior to joining the World Bank, Mr. Mohieldin held numerous positions in the Government of Egypt and served on several Boards of Directors in the Central Bank of Egypt and the corporate sector. He was a member of the Commission on Growth and Development and selected a Young Global Leader of the World Economic Forum in 2005.

His professional reach extends into the academic arena, serving as Member of the Board of several universities in Egypt and holding leading positions in national and regional research centers and think tanks. As a Professor of Economics, he has authored numerous publications and articles in leading journals in the fields of international finance and economics in English and Arabic.
