Duration and Introductory Note:

The seminar will have a duration of two and one half hours. During the first half of the event Bangkok, Hanoi, Jakarta, Vientiane, and Washington (moderator site) will participate as interactive sites. During the second half of the seminar, these sites will mute their mikes and participate as observer sites.

Port Moresby, Singapore, Tokyo, Phnom Penh, Ulaanbaatar and Washington will then be asked to unmute their mikes and participate as interactive sites during the second half. In this way, all sites will have an opportunity to participate equally in the discussions and Q&A sessions.
