**After the Conflict, comes the .....**

"If we used to be aware due to the conflicts, now we are conscious of robberies," said Rusli (45), a resident of Pidie, to Ceureumen. The man, who works as an entrepreneur, admitted that he was a bit concerned about the security in Aceh, especially with the numerous armed criminal actions lately going on in Aceh.

After the peace was reached, the number of armed criminal acts in Nanggroe Aceh Darussalam (NAD) has evidently increased. Take a look at the data from the Aceh Contrast Institution.

**The failure of re-integration**

The data mentioned that since the signing of the agreement on 15 August 2005 to this October, there have been 70 armed criminal acts in Aceh. And, still in reference to Aceh Contrast, out of the 17 robberies, 15 cases were strongly alleged to be conducted by former members of Free Aceh Movement (GAM).

Another source gave an assumption that the "allegation" was a form of claim that GAM members are supposedly robbers. Nonetheless, most cases took place in East Aceh (16 cases), North Aceh (14 cases), Pidie (13 cases), and Bireuen (11 cases). "When seen from the locations, the majority of the events took place in five districts known as the black area during conflict," said Hendra from Aceh Contrast.

This condition was seen by Aceh civil activists as the impact of poverty post tragedy and the government's failure in implementing the re-integration program. "The increase in criminality becomes evidence that there is something wrong in the re-integration process post peace agreement," said Akhiruddin from the Aceh Anti Corruption Movement (GeRAK). Information from the Aceh Peace Re-integration Institution (BRA) stated that re-integrations have not failed, since the process is not only about peng bicah (distributing small changes). Numerous sectors have been implemented. "Funds distribution is only one of the channels that is currently taking one step at a time," replied the Daily Executive of BRA, Yusny Saby.

### **Slow**

Other than that, according to Akhiruddin, the government seemed slow and not serious in handling the re-integration issues. Even BRA, which was supposed to take care of these re-integration issues, only works to channel funds. "Whereas what the former combatants need is not only funds, but also a guarantee in managing the capital and changes in behavior," he said.

### **CORRUPTION**

Reviewing the Performance of SAK BRR

What has the SAK BRR been doing lately? This is the question frequently inquired by the residents. This is because, as printed by numerous mass media, the quality of many of rehabilitation and reconstruction projects conducted by the BRR Aceh – Nias is disappointing. Meanwhile, the anti corruption task force, which was deliberately established by the BRR, has not been heard of.

Head of Anti Corruption Task Force (SAK) BRR Aceh – Nias, Achmad M.M. Jogasara stated that he could not explain directly how beneficial this SAK BRR is for the rehabilitation and reconstruction projects. "It is difficult to measure," he replied to Ceureumen last week. What was certain, he continued, the SAK BRR, in its work, remains to be oriented towards preventing corruption. This constitutes an orientation that differs from the steps taken by its predecessor, when the institution was headed by Kevin Evans. "Currently 55 percent of its focus is on prevention," stated Achmad M.M. Jogasara.

### **Three Functions**

He confirmed that there are three functions of SAK, which are prevention, investigation, and education. These three functions must be implemented. However, he said, the focus is more on prevention. In conducting monitoring towards goods and services packages, it is initiated by data collection, and thereafter, monitoring its every phase.

"Not to mention when there are complaints from interested parties, we have reached a condition where we are actually conducting audit towards such process. We review whether or not there was a fault in the procedures, or even a strong indication of CCN," continued Ade Dikdik Iskandar, the Manager of Corruption Prevention SAK BRR.

When questioned whether or not the corruption indication in the BRR in procurement of "Building the Land of Hope" books has previously ever been an issue in SAK, Achmad nodded his head.

"We have even conducted an investigative audit, and not just procedural. However, since the District Attorney's Office has stepped in we did not provide any opinion, since the District Attorney's Office has taken steps," he said.

Until now, SAK BRR has issued 233 recommendations directed to numerous parties involved in rehabilitation and reconstruction. For instance, concerning an indication of CNN, SAK issued 44 recommendations. (see box)

### Three cases to the KPK

Achmad explained that his institution had sent three corruption cases to the KPK (Corruption Eradication Committee). It was stated that his institution sent cases with very strong indication of corruption. However, the results highly depended on whether or not the KPK follow them up. "Concerning action is in the hands of the KPK law enforcement," he said. Unfortunately, he was reluctant to mention such case. What was certain, he said, the value of the projects reached billions of rupiah.

Achmad did not deny that deviation frequently happen on the field, especially for housing project. Even for Nias, he admitted, there were numerous deviations in housing projects, although SAK only investigated 15 percent of the sample.

That is why currently, especially for Nias, his institution no longer demanded to examine house samples, but the population or the entirety. This policy was applied because when SAK examined house samples, amounting to 15 percent, deviations were discovered in many of them. "We have asked the regional head to examine 100 percent of the population," he explained. SAK BRR hoped that this too can be applied in Aceh, in phases.

### Socialization

SAK BRR in cooperation with the KPK had also socialized issues concerning corruption eradication and its problems in 23 districts / cities in Aceh and Nias. "We invited all of the stakeholders, such as NGO, Regional Government, Companies Association, etc.," he explained. Until now, he added, the community understood that an action is considered corruption if it has caused the state losses. Even some of the community, he said, still assumed that SAK BRR interfered with rehabilitation and reconstruction, including those from the internal of BRR itself. Now, who are those people? Jogasara was reluctant to disclose them.

Renters Fight against BRR Policies**

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Tens of thousands of houses have been built and are being built. Aceh, the majority of which was flattened hit by the tsunami tidal wave, has begun to rise. And the houses appeared like fungus during the wet season. They grow anywhere. A sign that reconstruction and rehabilitation had rapidly started.

Syhabani (42), a refugee, victim of tsunami, from the Mulia Kampong, Banda Aceh, witnessed the rapid construction of housing units. Unfortunately, Syhabani was not the owner of one of those houses. The widow with six children could only feel left out since she shall not and shall never receive housing aid.

The reason? Syhabani was only a tsunami victim, who when the tragedy hit two years ago had a status of renter, a.k.a leasing someone's house, a.k.a never had a house in Banda Aceh.

"I have been living in Banda Aceh for 20 years, my husband was a fish merchant. And he died because of the tsunami," she said to Ceureumen when visiting her in the Refugee Barrack Lhong Stadium, Banda Aceh.

### **Has filled in forms**

Syahbani was not the only one feeling anxious. Many of the people living in barracks, who used to be renters, were currently in confusion. They hoped that the Government, through the Rehabilitation and Reconstruction Body (BRR) immediately provided housing aid.

"Especially when we heard that this December the barracks must be torn down because the land lease is up. Where do all of us have to go?", said Muhammad (50), one of the residents of Lhok Ngan barrack with a concerned face.

While blowing smokes from his black and blue lips. Muhammad explained that he has filled in the forms of housing aid from an aid institution in Aceh.

And evidently, it was similar to what was experienced by Efendi, a resident of Stadium Lhoong barrack.

"I do not recall how many times we have filled in forms. And how many times our pictures have been taken. Still, there is no house," Efendi complained.

### **All are expensive**

However, some time ago a number of barrack residents heard that renters shall never receive housing aids.

"It was said that we did not lose houses like the rest. However, we are also victims. I even lost my husband," said Syahbani while giving a false smile.

What was certain was that after their staying period is due, Syahbani, Efendi, and Muhammad do not know where they would live. Don't even think about building a house when they cannot even afford to rent one.

"The house lease rate is extremely expensive. How can we, victims of tsunami, afford to stay in a rented house," said Syahbani seriously.

### **BSBT Funds**

Renters indeed shall receive aid amounting to 40 percent of the average price of one type 36 house, without tax. Based on the development, the mentioned 40 percent shall be added with Rp.5 million to purchase land.

"These renters shall be given such funds, which thereafter shall be called residential social aid funds or BSBT," said Kasru Susilo, an advisor of Policies and Program of BRR.

Concerning barracks in particular, Kasru said that the land lease of all barracks shall be due in April 2007. "Therefore, we shall try that all renters shall receive aid before April 2007, thus they can have another place to live, other than the barrack," he said.

Nonetheless, Kasru was certain that problems shall occur during identification of tsunami victims, who were renters. "However, we shall try to work it out," he said.

It seems like the wishes of the tsunami victims are getting further away.

6 reasons the BRR provided Residential Social Aid (BSBT) to renters?

1. Renting a place to stay
2. Conducting Residential Leasing Contract
3. Conducting residential lease – buy contract
4. As a down payment to purchase a house for Housing Ownership Loan (KPR) installments
5. Purchase a ready to be built land to be used to build their own house
6. Build a house upon its own land in another location or land that is given to the concerning party

7 reasons why tsunami victims who were renters expected housing aid

1. Most of the renters has low income thus shall never afford to build a house
2. They are also victims of tsunami, and they too lost their assets and lives
3. The Residential Social Aid (BSBT) funds to be distributed is insufficient to build a house

4. The price of house lease in Banda Aceh is extremely high
5. Building a house needs materials, and in Aceh the price of materials is expensive
6. It is difficult to find a low price land
7. They have received many promises of housing aid from Non Governmental Organizations and the BRR

**Pilkada is coming soon, however.....**

The tragedy two years ago also wiped out Lhokseudu, Aceh Besar. Currently, residents in such area have woken up again after almost two years. 213 residents who survived still have not yet enjoyed electricity. Information has become luxury goods, especially stories about Regional Head Election.

“There is no radio. For newspapers, we have to buy them in the city, which is far. The fee for L-300 is expensive,” said Faisal, a local resident. L-300 is a mini bus that becomes the primary public transportation between districts on the shore of Aceh west coast. Prior to the tsunami, the fee from Lhokseudu to Banda Aceh was Rp.5,000 one way. Now, it has skyrocketed to more than twice the previous fee.

#### **Do not know Pilkada**

Therefore, it is not a surprise if the information concerning the Election of new governors and district heads has not reached the area. “But you do know that there shall be an election for new governors and district heads on the 11<sup>th</sup> of December, right?”, I asked again. Faisal was silent. He then shook his head.

Lhokseudu was one of the four sub-villages that were located on Layeun kampong, Lhoong Sub District, Aceh Besar. The other three sub villages, Teungoh, Ujong, and Singgahan sub villages. The location of such sub villages were exactly off the shore, and were passed by the main road of Banda Aceh – Meulaboh. The hills were located behind the residential area.

The time needed from Banda Aceh to Lhokseudu was one hour. The road condition was highly damaged. Bumps on the land that were deliberately made higher, or road bumps, prevented all vehicles to drive recklessly. The roads were dusty during the dry season, and flooded with water when raining.

#### **In need of more information**

Teuku Bukhari, Head of Lhokseudu sub village, confirmed the minimum information that can be accessed by his residents due to bad infrastructures. News about Regional Head Election or Pilkada was only slightly heard. Even until the second week of October, no officer has come to take data of voters in his village.

“We only hear rumors, but we’re not certain about the exact time. Our gampong does not receive proper attention,” said Bukhari. He has been the head of sub village for six years.

The Independent Commission of Election (KIP) has decided the date, 11 December 2006, as the voting date since a long time ago. Other than choosing a pair of governor and deputy governor, at such day, residents from 19 districts and cities shall also choose a pair of district head and deputy district head or mayor and deputy mayor.

#### **High Cost**

According to KIP’s record, the temporary number of voters up to mid September was 2,556,115 persons and the voting locations were estimated to be 8,579. (See box of DPS & TPS tabulation). The budget needed reached Rp.17.25 billion. The amount of funds for Aceh Besar was Rp.2.043 billion.

This shall become the largest democracy celebration in the history of Aceh. The European Union commission and a number of foreign countries have planned to release monitoring teams during the election process. This Pilkada really determines the fate and future of Aceh.

Nevertheless, Yunus has no expectation at all concerning the Pilkada. He is a resident in Meunasah sub village. Almost one year after the tragedy, the 43 year old man opened up a small convenient store in front of the stage house with wooden walls (traditional house), provided by American Red Cross.

"We are only gampong people. We participate in the election because others do. Whether we vote or not, there is no difference," he said to me. Pilkada is indeed coming soon, however... Samiaji Bintang is a Pantau syndicated contributor in Banda Aceh.

### **The Story about General Election in the past**

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When the general election or pemilu was held in Aceh in 1999, participation from the voters was no more than 30 percent of total citizens. This was the form of boycott from the residents of the land of Rencong towards the government of Jakarta that still established Aceh as Military Region. Thousands of lives were killed when the military conducted their operations.

Millions of citizens of Aceh were not interested in the pemilu. Residents even demanded the implementation of referendum, as provided by the government of Jakarta to Timor Leste. Graffiti of "referendum" were merrier compared to the symbols and flags of political parties. The act of demanding referendum was attended by far more residents compared to that of parties' campaigns.

#### **Roles of the Army**

In Pemilu 2004, the percentage of participation of voters in Aceh was reported to have increased by up to 94%. The reporter was General Ryamizard Ryacudu. At the time he was the Head of Army Staff (Kasad) of Indonesian Army (TNI). According to Ryamizard, participation of residents increased due to the roles of the Army and Police in securing the implementation of Pemilu. Ryamizard's report was denied by a number of international non-governmental organizations. Imparsial was one of them. This institution was chaired by Munir, a human rights activist, who died from poisoning on board of the plane of Garuda on his way to Amsterdam from Jakarta. The State Intelligence Institution was alleged to be behind this ruthless murder. Other than Imparsial, other institutions such as Center for Electoral Reform, Komisi Orang Hilang dan Tindak Kekerasan, Aceh Election Watch, Aceh Working Group, and Jari also denied the report from Ryamizard.

#### **"Emergency" Pemilu**

According to them, the mentioned number was impossible to be proven and believed. This is because Aceh was still in a state of emergency. It was possible that people take part in Pemilu under pressure or force. At the time, even the General Election Commission did not issue an official statement concerning voters in Aceh.

"The security at the time was indeed a bit difficult," Abdullah, a resident of Meunasah sub village in Pasi gampong, replied. Its location was between hills and ocean. After the tsunami, only 336 lives survived, out of 1,200 residents, who used to live there. More than half of the land turned into a pool. The people's livelihood was usually farming and fishing.

Previously, Abdullah was a member of People Security (Kamra), which secured the Voting Location (TPS). Currently Abdullah is a member of Committee of Election of Pasi Gampong (PPG Pasi). His responsibilities are record data, distribute information, and up to prepare tools and logistics.

However, Abdullah is more optimistic now. "Compared to the previous, the current, if God wills, is far more secure," he said. One year after the Helsinki peace agreement, Aceh looks far better. One of the items in the agreement was Pilkada.

#### Who are your candidates?

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For Ridwan (34), a resident of Gampong Lhang Pidie residential area, this question is difficult to answer. "There are so many candidates, I am now still reviewing which one is the best," he said. Ridwan acknowledged that he knows a number of candidates, who shall fight in the coming Aceh regional head election (pilkada). However, he refused to comment whether or not he shall choose. "It is a secret, but for certain I have not decided anything yet," he said seriously. Different from Ridwan, who has not had a good candidate, Azman (36), resident of Sigli, had an opinion that whoever the candidate is, it must be kept a secret. "Although we have reached the peace, we must also be really certain. Especially when it was not only politicians who take part, but also GAM," he said seriously.

#### Too many candidates

Residents in Pidie District in general do not think too much about Pilkada. Residents in Tangse Pidie area, for examples, were too busy with anthrax attacking their cattle.

"Do you think the elected Pilkada would want to visit us in a remote area like this?", they asked Ceureumen.

Nevertheless, they had a special comment concerning Pilkada in the coming December. "There are so many candidates. Not to mention the candidate for District Head of Pidie," said Marwan, a resident of Tangse. A number of locations in Tangse area were also full with posters and stickers of candidates. However, only some of the candidates have such. The area of Teubeng, Pidie, an area that was once a conflict area, seem calmer. "We know about the candidates only from newspapers or banners. However, what they plan for the future was not clear," said Muhammad seriously.

### **Asked about Pilkada, How is UUPA**

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the news about Pilkada had spread. However, the information and essence are still not quite even. How could it? In a number of areas, the residents were still in the dark concerning such. "There are so many candidates, who shall we choose," asked Saiful Azmi. A resident of Busu, Mutiara Barat Sub District, Pidie District, admitted that he was a bit confused. Other than the numerous candidates, whether in the election of governor or the district head. He admitted that until now he has not made any choice.

### **Ask about UUPA**

Different with Muhammad, Rusli, and Teungku Adnan. The three residents of Barat Yaman village, Mutiara Sub District, absorbed more information. They are more aware about the politics. Nevertheless, without eliminating the animosity in Pilkada, they stroke with another question. How about the fate of the points in Helsinki agreement. The problem they refer to was Law No 11 of the year 2006 concerning Laws of Government of Aceh. "If these have not been taken care of, it shall be quite difficult to make Pilkada a success," said Tgk Adnan.

Other people also asked about the "fate" of UUPA. Especially when the follow up by media was so minimum. Almost all media were more focused on the Pilkada, which was also mentioned in the MoU Helsinki, which was described through the UUPA.

### **Take part in Pilkada**

A number of elite in Free Aceh Movement shall also take part in the democracy celebration, which shall be held in the coming 11<sup>th</sup> December. Personally for certain, and not on behalf of an institution. They fight starting from the level of governor to mayor and district head. Taking part in Pilkada does not make GAM forget about their primary responsibility in fighting for UUPA. Elements bound in the agreement are deeply related with this issue. Especially when they also "a bit" objected to a number of articles in such Law.

Some time ago, a former representative of GAM in Aceh Monitoring Mission (AMM), Irwandi Yusuf, said that they had submitted objection to the institution chaired by Peter Fieth.

"We are waiting for the results. There shall be results probably before the AMM finished their time," said Amni bin Ahmad marzuki, a member of Commission of GAM. "Pilkada must go on, UUPA must also be in accordance with MoU."

### **Cooking is Easy**

Anchovies cooked with chilly and petai

The recipe this time shall present a cooking with anchovies as primary ingredient, which we often see in markets. To add the flavor, they shall be completed with petai that we often see in markets. It is perfect for lunch.

Ingredients

200 gram of anchovies

2 young petai

Cooking oil for frying  
1 teaspoon of lime juice

Put in lime juice and stir until the spice is cooked and oily.  
Put in the anchovies and petai.  
Serve immediately.

**A:** According to Article 33 point 2 Qanun No. 7 of the year 2006 concerning Election of Governor / Deputy of Governor, Head District / Deputy of Head District, and Mayor / Deputy Mayor in Province of NAD, it was mentioned that "Candidates must meet the requirements as follows; (k) Submit the list of personal wealth, and be willing to have it publicized."

According to Zainuddin T., a member of the Provincial Election Independent Commission (KIP), this article means that candidates must be willing if KIP announces their wealth. On the other side, it also means that KIP has no obligation to announce the wealth of candidates. Which means that it may or may not be announced. According to Zainuddin T., the process of making the forms of wealth, that must be filled in by candidates, available, verification, and others were all handled by the KPK or the Corruption Eradication Commission.

Report of Wealth not in accordance with facts

**Q:** if there is a candidate, who reports wealth that is not in accordance with facts, or if there are other abnormalities, where should we report to? For certain intention, is not possible that they tend to reduce their wealth, or the opposite?

**My village Meuraxa**  
**Good Morning Meuraxa.....**

One afternoon, Meuraxa is still chaotic. Not much have changed, even though the earthquake disaster and the tsunami waves have passed almost two years ago. Although several housing aid from the donor institutions has been build, nevertheless they have not managed to erase the extensive land and the leftover ruins of the buildings in the buffer zone area.

In the midst of the extensive infertile land and the ruins, a radio antenna comes into sight and it stood obstinately. The radio station, which is located next to the mass burial ground, is no other than the community radio that belongs to the district community of Meuraxa.

The procurement of the radio facility is prepared by an active grass root-based institution that develops media information, or known as the Combine Resource Institution. It was established three months ago through a mutual agreement with the local community representatives.

### **Activities**

If usually the two broadcasters greets the community to entertain them by extending information and playing their songs collection. Last week was a little different. It was unusual to see rows of motorcycles and voices behind the wall of the 2 x 3 building. They are the community of Meuraxa who are gathered for a weekly discussion by the radio organizer.

This weekly activity is usually carried out by the radio organizer or known as the Corps of the Community Broadcast Organizer (BPPK). This forum discussed on the activities plan and the problems faced by the radio.

Generally, the representatives of the Community Broadcasting Council (DPK) a term for the community representatives who referred as the policy decision makers in that institution always attended the meetings.

Not only DPK and BPPK, usually the organizer also invites the representatives of each village in Meuraxa, to discussed the same matter. This is part to broaden the radio socialization, thus it will arouse a sense of belonging in each of the community's heart.

### **Information**

Not only the "Radio Meuraxa" plays requested songs and exchange greetings, it also presents information and news on the development of the rehabilitation and reconstruction process in that area.

The information varies, starting from information on the housing construction, refugee's fate, grants, economy activities, until the fraudulent that occurs on the economy activities.

Beside news, that group of teenagers have conducted a talk show program. Not quite adequate, they manage to present a representative of an international institution as caliber as United Nation as their resource person.

The talk show is usually filled with discussion on the viewpoint of the institution in charge concerning problems that occurred, which of course in correlation either direct or indirect with the institution.

The result, many people who listened to the talk show sent their queries and comments by short message service. "We had invited the community members on our talk show program, "It is accustomed for an official to be invited, but if a common person, who would care," he said boldly. This radio as though reminds us of a sequel in a movie named "Good Morning Vietnam". It is presented to raise the life enthusiasm of the American soldiers during the war. Every morning, Adrian Cronauer, the broadcaster from the information division used to greet his fellow friends with a high pitching voice "Gooooood Morrriiiiing Vieetnaaaamm!"

Therefore, with this radio, hopefully it can be a means or whatever the name is, to hoist again the life enthusiasm of the Meuraxa community.

Tamlicha Ali:

The People need the Indonesian National Army (TNI) and the Republic of Indonesia Police Force (Polri)

Retired Lieutenant General Tamlicha Al Muntadzar Ali, is one of the candidates for governor. He will be in twosome with Drs. Tgk Harmen Nuriqmar in the coming Regional Head Election (Pilkada). How is his pattern of thoughts regarding Aceh. Following is a brief interview with the man who has a thick moustache.

What is your reason to run as a candidate for the governor?

I am an Acehnese who has been involved in the military and other governmental assignments for almost 40 years and all assignments are away from Aceh. Therefore, I have never been assigned in Aceh. I watched the development of Aceh, and it is very miserable, from the beginning Aceh is already in conflict, then the tsunami, which is quite aggravating, so my heart is touched; trembles, but I have never been given a chance to serve here. I pray to Allah, please give me a chance to serve Aceh, as the situation is very difficult.

That means you are very optimistic, from where are the constituencies?

There should be an optimistic determination, although we certainly will look at the reality in a realistic way. Moreover, the most important thing, it depends on the people of Aceh. If I would be chosen, I would lead Aceh the best I could. However, even if I would not be chosen, if Allah allows I would still think about Aceh in a different way. In fact, I was hoping to have the support from members of TNI and Polri. Subsequently, I had served as the Secretary General of the Ministry of Transmigration. Therefore, maybe there will be votes from the transmigration community. Hence, what is more prominent, since the candidate for my deputy governor is a young ulema, therefore, I hope for the ulema network and the Muslim seminarian network. Those are the prime constituencies that will support me.

What is your opinion on TNI's negative image in Aceh in the past?

I think, the image could be carried forever or it could be changed. In addition, I am certain that the passed image was created by several behaviors or maybe by several thugs. I was a military officer, used to be a commander, and I tried to inculcate good discipline. I always taught my subordinates to respect their people. Therefore, I think it all depends on their superior. A good leader, a strong leader could really take good care of their subordinates, so there would not be any occurrences. Thus, in the future, if I made it, I would try to embrace the TNI and Polri leaders and together we build Aceh. I am positive that the people need TNI and Polri.

Aren't you reluctant to compete with other retired personnel?

I move forward, whether it is one or two, it is the democracy's right. In addition, the TNI members have their democracy right to choose their TNI members who happened to be the candidates.

However, the people questioned on the frequently change of your deputy?

It is true, initially it was Pak Mukhlis Mukhtar as my deputy, but he got sick, therefore, I replaced him. If not, I could not move forward. Afterward, we inquired the Democratic Party that has joined us earlier, who will be the deputy governor candidate replacing Pak Mukhlis. Then, they mutually agreed that Pak Nova would be the replacement. After that, there were these internal matters and maybe they have their own consideration, he then step down. Thank you Allah, later I acquired a representative from Star Reform Party (PBR), who is Tgk Harmen Nuriqmar.

What is your view in the implementation of the Islamic Law in Aceh?

I precisely assumed that the Islamic Law is fundamental for the people of Aceh. The determination to uphold the Islamic Law, should actually be programmed systematically and continually. That is my consideration that is why I choose an Ulema to be my Deputy Governor.

**Victim questions, BRA answers**

During the middle of last August, the Aceh Peace Reintegrated Organization (BRA) launches the economic empowerment program called Reintegrated Aid Community- Based for Conflict Victims. This program changes the distribution approach, which initially was proposal-based to community-based.

By applying the mechanism of Regional Development Program (PPK), which are spread all over the villages in 17 regions of Aceh and received the people's trust, BRA hoped that the people, victims of conflict would receive the relieve as fair as possible.

Until now, many questioned on the fund distribution mechanism for victims of conflict. Through this Ceureumen tabloid, every month a team from BRA would answer the people's questions that are received by sms. Following are the questions and answers for this month.

**BRA-PPK Policy**

How is the clear mechanism of handling corruption cases that occurred during the implementation of the Reintegrated Aid Community-Based for Conflict Victims program?

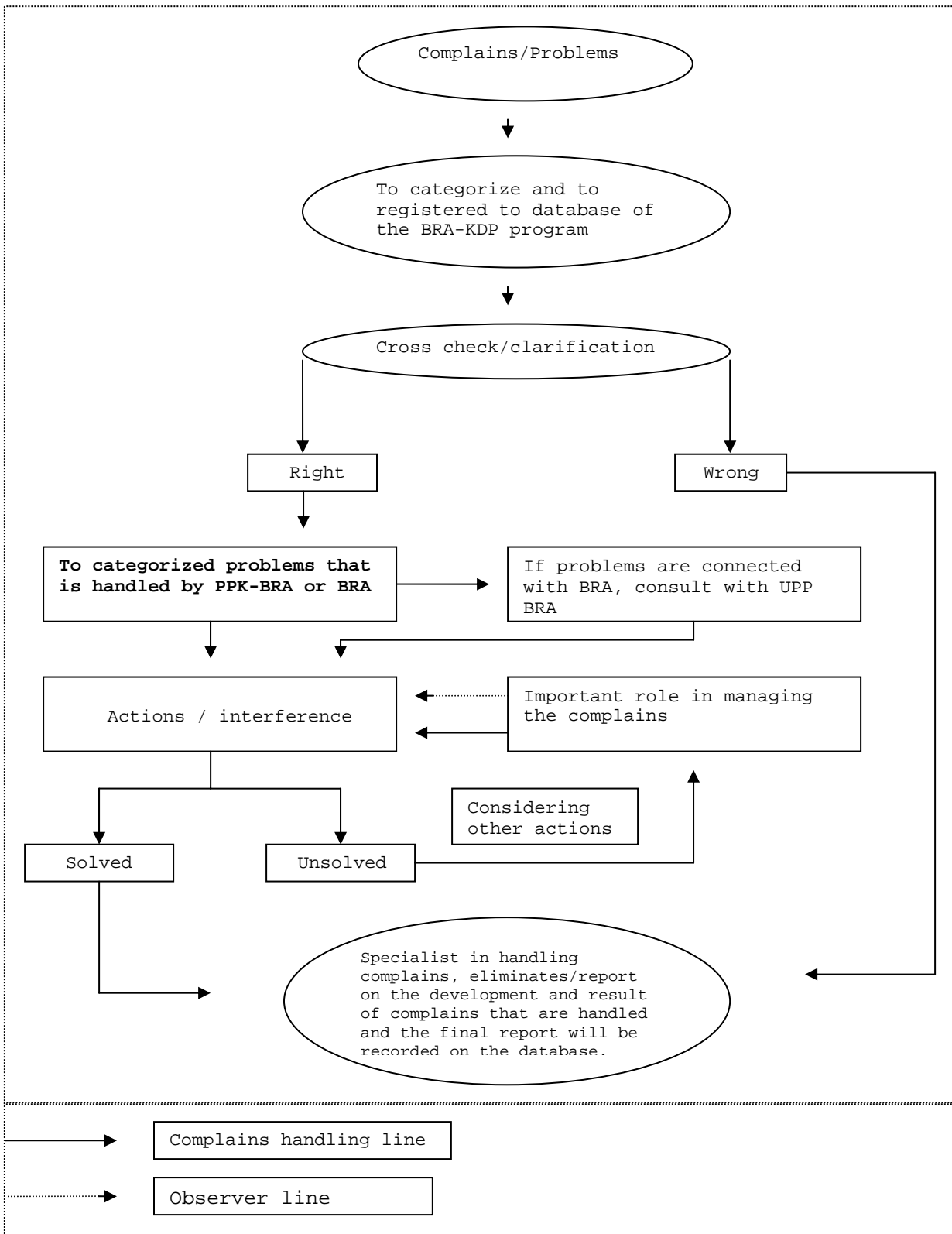

**It started from a deliberation**

How far are the steps of handling this relieve program has been going on, kindly explain so that the people would not question on why there is no realization yet on the fund relieve?

The training for the facilitators has just ended. In two weeks time, the deliberation within the village socialization could be carried out. The deliberation within the village socialization would be the primary step of the cycles of activities, where the programs would be socialized to the people in the region. In this deliberation, the people will form a FD training schedule, set the employment of the operational fund of 6% and to set the amount of allocation for each village.

**The difference of this program**

What is the difference between managing the diyat problems, housing aid and health relieve with this new program? The BRA executor agency has three sections of program, which are the economic empowerment, social cultural and data and the evaluation monitoring (monev). The provision of diyat, housing aid and health relieve are the programs from the social section, while the provision for the economic empowerment aid are for the former TNA, former political prisoners, GAM non TNA, GAM who surrender prior to the MoU, PETA volunteers and the victims of conflict. The Reintegrated Aid Community-Based for Conflict Victims program is part of the economic empowerment section.

**When will the fund be disbursed?**

The first phase of fund of 6% is precedence for the operational activities and will be disburse soon after the deliberation within the village socialization (MAD 1), around end of October or early November. The second phase of fund of 50% will be distributed when the village is ready to execute the program following the signing of the Regency Resolution Letter, approximately one month after the first phase disbursement. The last phase of fund disbursement of 44% will be executed following the deliberation of the accountability.
