The World Bank Group Entrepreneurship Snapshots (WBGES) tracks new business registration around the world; data from this survey can be used to study the factors that foster dynamic private sector growth.

The measurement of entrepreneurship in 112 developing and high-income economies over 2004-09 offers a distinctive and timely snapshot of the impact of the 2008 financial crisis on entrepreneurial activity. These results can help guide effective policy making and deliver new capabilities for identifying the impact of reforms.
