*UNGASS Reporting and Implementing the Three Ones: One National Monitoring And Evaluation System:
Lessons Learned From Four Countries*

The aim of this session is to bring together senior HIV/AIDS managers from countries across the world to discuss how regular reporting of monitoring and evaluation information can improve the management of the epidemic.

The session will highlight the efforts undertaken in Botswana, The Commonwealth of Dominica, Ethiopia, India, and Myanmar and will take place in a dialogue setting. The session will respond to the following 4 questions:

1. *How relevant is UNGASS or global reporting for helping to get a snapshot of the epidemic?*
2. *What evidence do we have that reporting on UNGASS or other indicators is resulting in improving programming and decision making?*
3. *Is there enough evidence in countries to support an understanding of the trends of the epidemic and where and which prevention strategies would be the most useful?*
4. *What is the most important contribution from the M&E system in the five countries towards helping to monitor and manage the epidemic and to determine what is not working?*
