(the Study Program)

The Middle East & North Africa Region (MNA) of the World Bank has established a multi-donor Trust Fund to finance a comprehensive feasibility study and an environmental and social assessment for water transfer from the Red Sea to the Dead Sea (the Study Program). The Study Program will be managed by the World Bank at the joint request of Jordan, the Palestinian Authority and Israel. The overall objective of the Study Program is to evaluate the conveyance of water from the Red Sea to the Dead Sea as a way to address environmental degradation of the Dead Sea Region and examine the possibility of seawater desalination and energy production as additional options.

The Study Program services include two separately executed but interrelated components: A. Feasibility Study and B. Environmental and Social Assessment. Each component must be completed within 24 months from the signing of the contract.

The World Bank now invites eligible consulting firms to indicate their interest in providing the services for either or both of the components of the Study Program. Interested consulting firms must submit a separate Expression of Interest for A. Feasibility Study and B. Environmental and Social Assessment. For each component, they must provide information indicating that they are qualified to perform the services under this component (brochures, description of similar assignments, experience in similar conditions, availability of appropriate skills among staff, etc.). Consultants may associate with other consultants as joint ventures, consortia, etc. to enhance their qualifications.

Consultants will be selected in accordance with the procedures set out in the current edition of the World Bank's Guidelines: Selection and Employment of Consultants by World Bank Borrowers. Separate short lists will be established for A. Feasibility Study and B. Environmental and Social Assessment. All firms that expressed an interest, as well as any other firm that so requests, will be provided the final short lists of firms.

This website provides an Information Sheet, a condensed version of the terms of reference for the Study Program, an advisory note on dealing with conflicts of interest between these assignments and future assignments under the same activity.
