- 1 Building a stable macro economy.
- 2 Making the Philippines a good place to do business.
- 3 Working with local communities and improving access to education, health care, safe drinking water, and other basic services.
- 4 Protecting the poor, especially in times of economic crisis, natural disasters, and armed conflict.
- 5 Improving governance and citizen involvement for better transparency and accountability.

Who can participate?

The photo competition is open to all young Filipinos between the ages of 16 and 25 years old. If you are at least 18 and not older than 25 by October 15, 2009, you can participate.

Format

- Entries should be taken with any camera using at least 135mm colored film or digital camera set at a resolution of at least 300 dpi.
- Entries should be submitted in at least (5 x 7 inches) prints with border (whether taken with 135mm film or digital camera).
- Using software to adjust a photo's color, resolution, or similar properties is allowed. However, layering, superimposition, or other similar photo manipulation is not allowed.

Documentation

- A participant can submit multiple entries, but can win only once per category.
- For entries selected in the pre-screening process, the participant will be requested to submit the following: negatives and/or original digital files; and the participant's photo.
- Participants must attach an entry form containing the following information:
 - Category and photo title
 - Brief caption: maximum of 20 words maximum, written either in Filipino or in English
 - Date and place taken
 - Name of participant and contact details (mailing address; telephone; e-mail address)
 - Participant's profile: birth date; gender; occupation
 - A copy of any of the following: valid ID that shows birth date; birth certificate; passport
- Each entry must include the following statement: "I certify that I personally took this photograph on the date and place stated, and that I personally hold the copyright for this photo." (Add signature above printed name.)
- Each entry, with the filled-out entry form, must be sealed in an envelope. Only the photo title, category, and the phrase "Entry for Making Growth Work for the Poor Photo Competition" must appear outside the envelope.
- References to specific individuals, firms, or schools, which might reveal the participant's identity, are discouraged. Do not indicate your name anywhere on your work.

Copyright

- All submissions must be original. No previously published material will be accepted. Any form of plagiarism will result in automatic disqualification.
- Winning entries will be featured in the World Bank Office Manila 2010 Country Assistance Strategy (CAS) calendar, website, publications, posters, exhibits, and other materials and activities. The photographers will be duly acknowledged when their photos are used in World Bank materials or activities.
- The World Bank shall have the right to use all submitted photos for non-commercial purposes in activities and media as listed above, with no additional remuneration to the photographer or his/her institution.
- The World Bank reserves the right to modify the format and content of the submissions for publication purposes.
