### EMIGRATION, 2010

- Stock of emigrants: **3,739.1 thousands**
- Stock of emigrants as percentage of population: **4.4%**
- Top destination countries: Saudi Arabia, Jordan, Libya, Kuwait, the United Arab Emirates, the United States, West Bank and Gaza, Italy, Qatar, the Republic of Yemen

### SKILLED EMIGRATION, 2000

- Emigration rate of tertiary-educated population: **4.6%**
- Emigration of physicians:
  - (a) **7,791** or **5.4%** of physicians trained in the country (*Source: Bhargava, Docquier, and Moullan 2010*)
  - (b) **7,119** or **4.7%** of physicians born in the country (*Source: Clemens and Pettersson 2006*)
- Emigration of nurses: **992** or **0.5%** of nurses born in the country

- Stock of immigrants as percentage of population: **0.3%**
- Females as percentage of immigrants: **46.6%**
- Refugees as percentage of immigrants: **37.9%**
