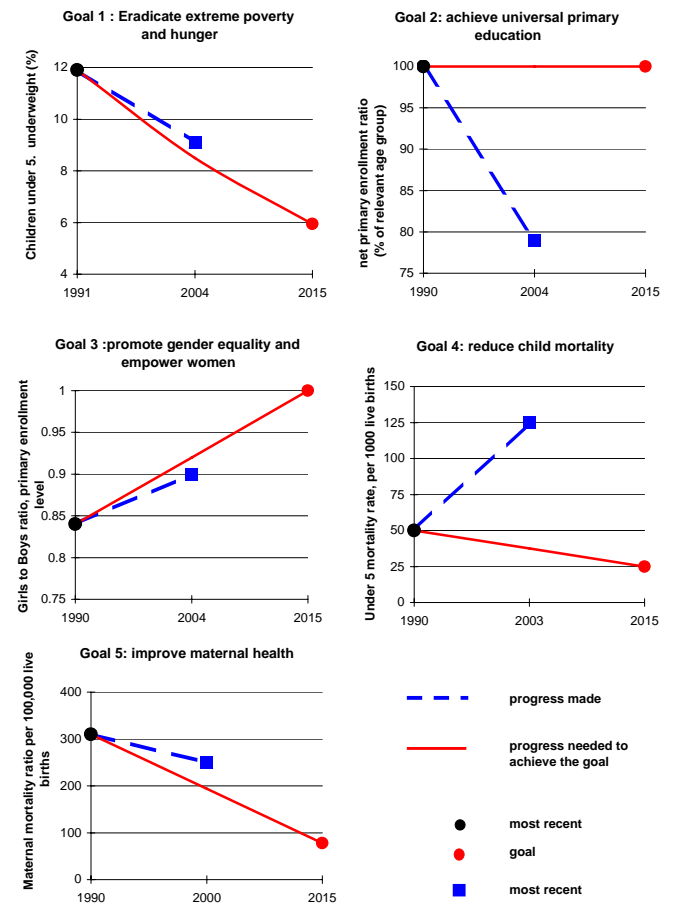


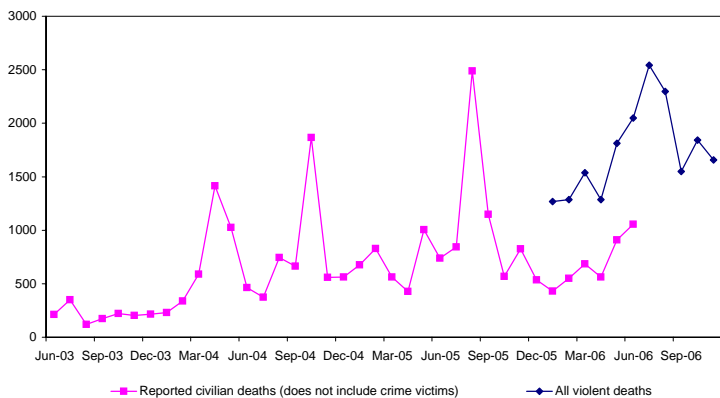

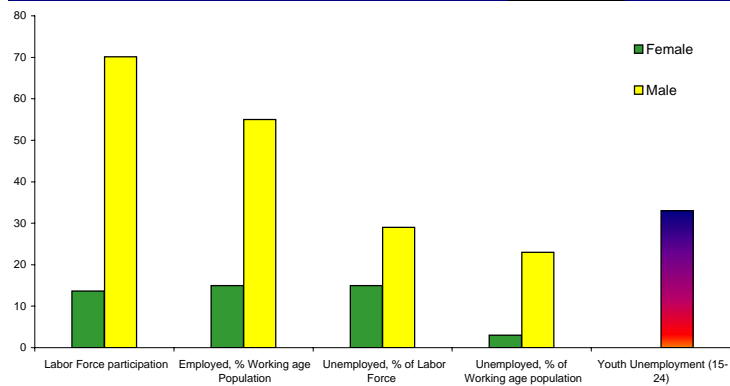
Millennium goals and indicators for Iraq⁴



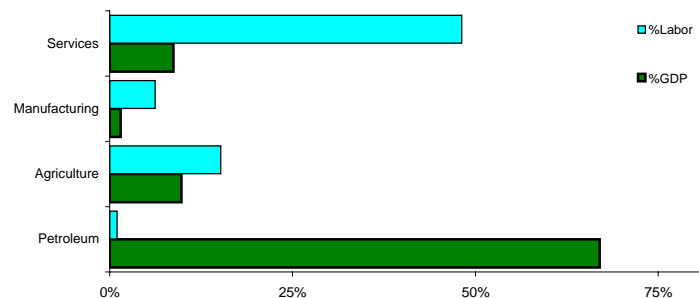
Reported civilian deaths as a result of acts of war and violence⁵



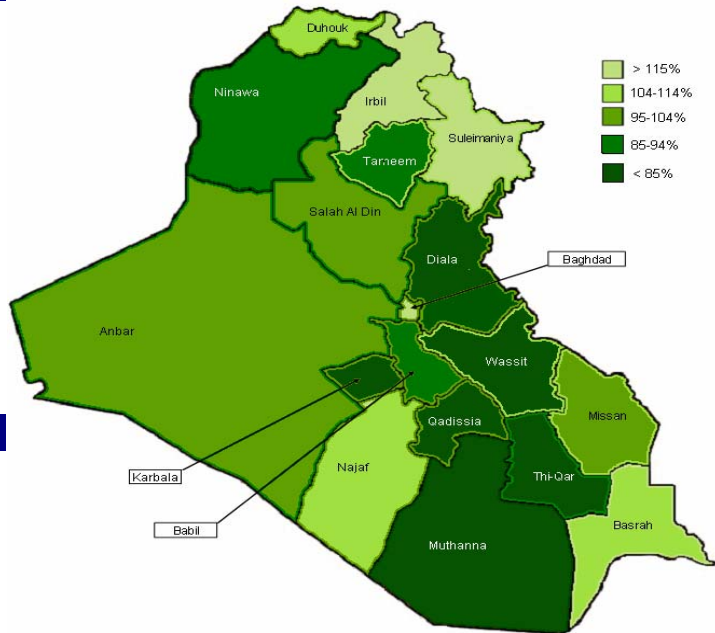
Labor Force and Unemployment 2004e (percent)²

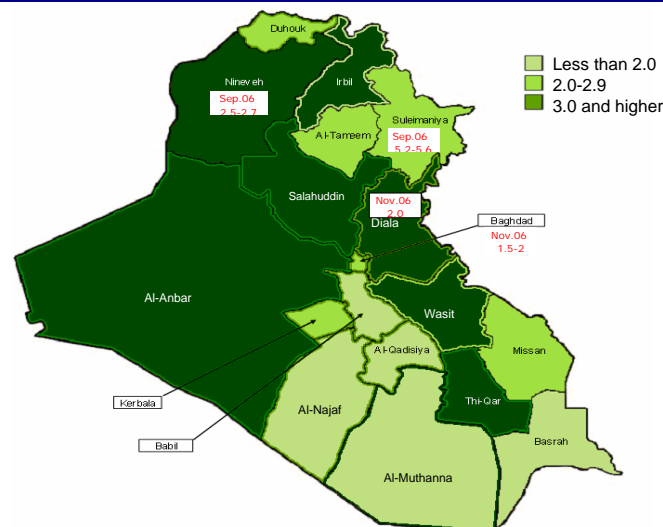

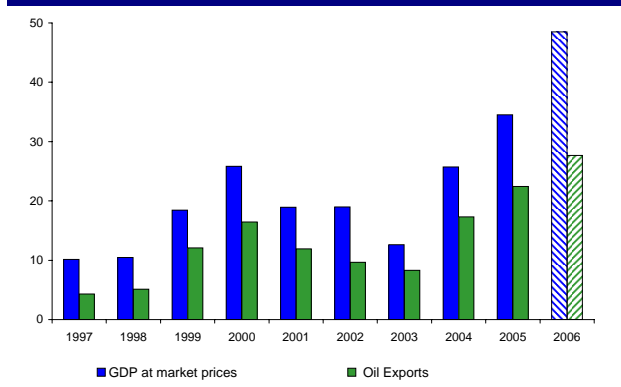

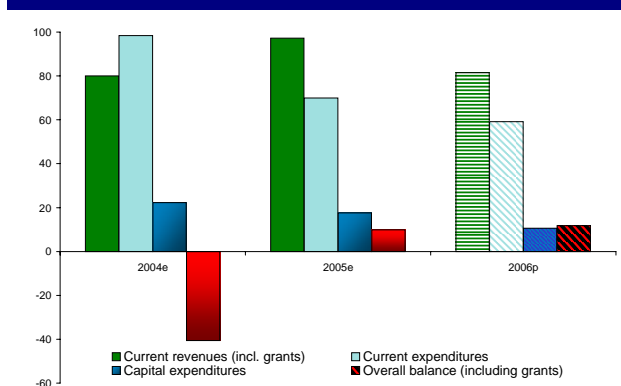
Gasoline: ratio of black market price to official price, March 2006⁵



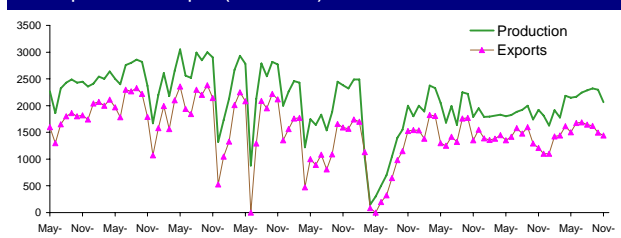
Nominal GDP and crude oil exports (US\$ billion)



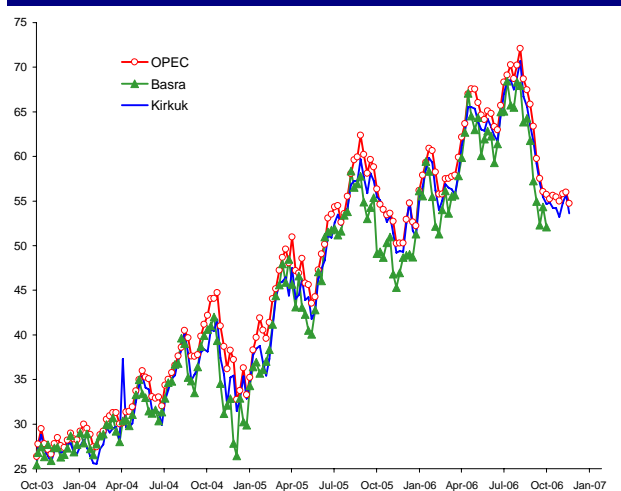
Public finances (percent of GDP)



Crude oil production and exports (thousand b/d)⁴

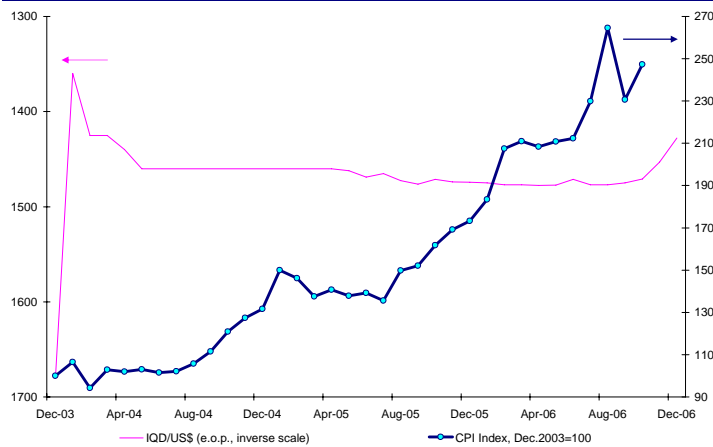


Weekly spot crude oil prices (US\$/barrel)⁶

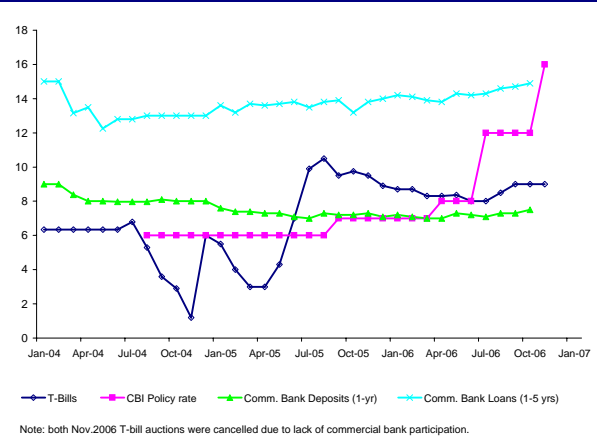

Exchange rate and consumer price index



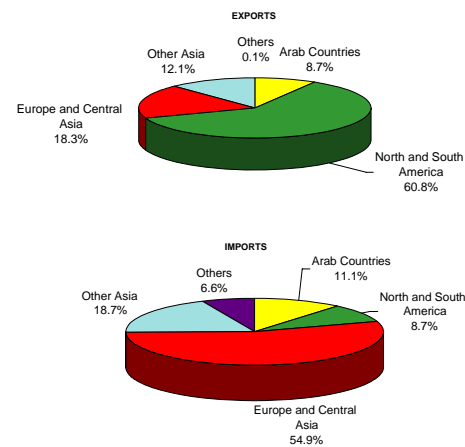
Nominal interest rates (percent)

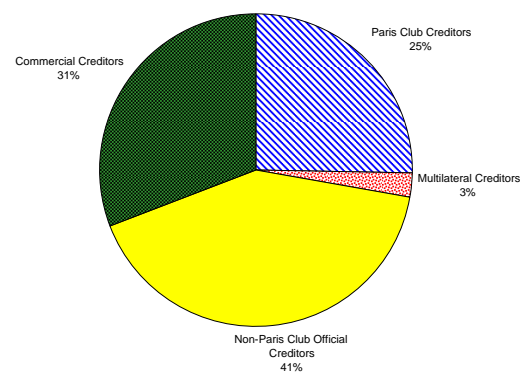
Geographical composition of merchandise trade, 2004



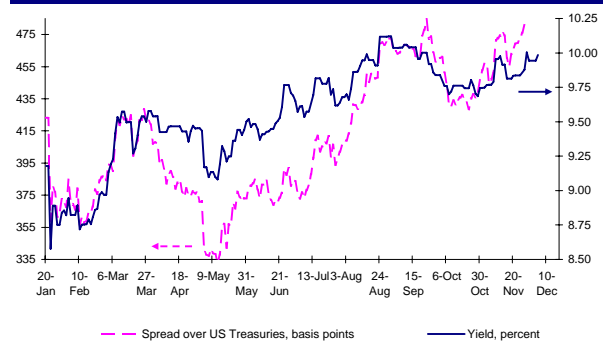
