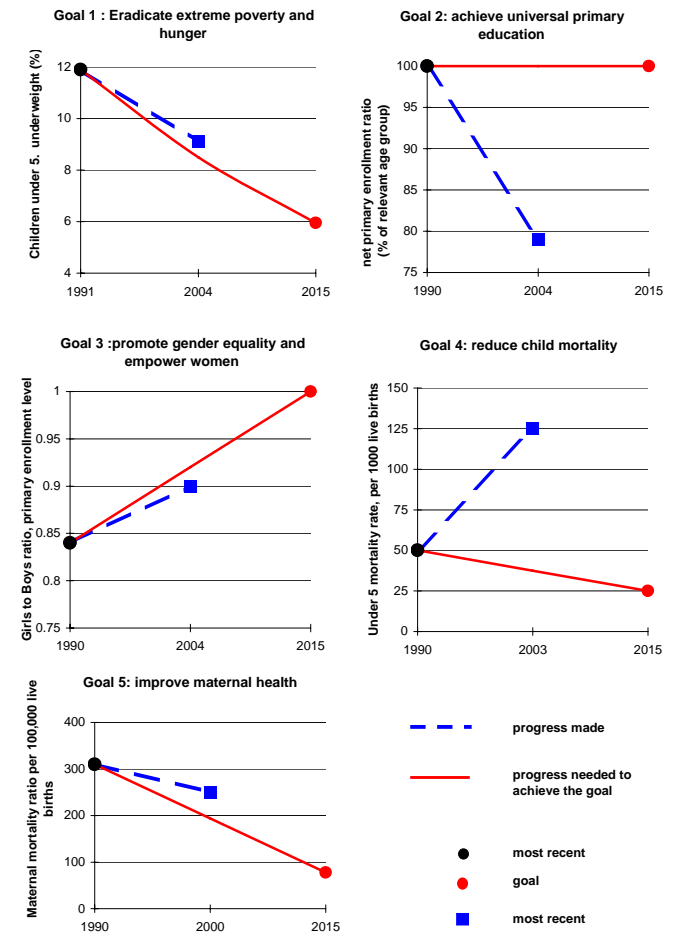
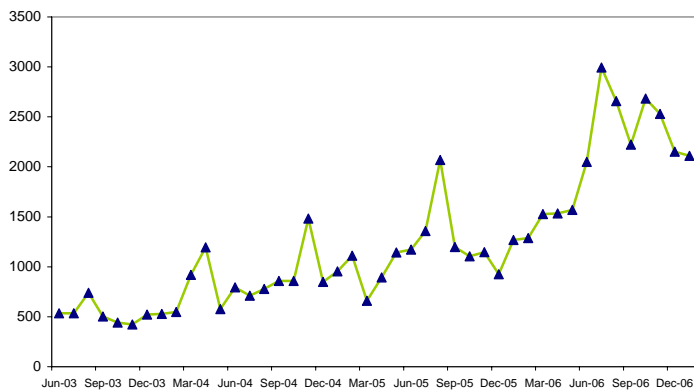

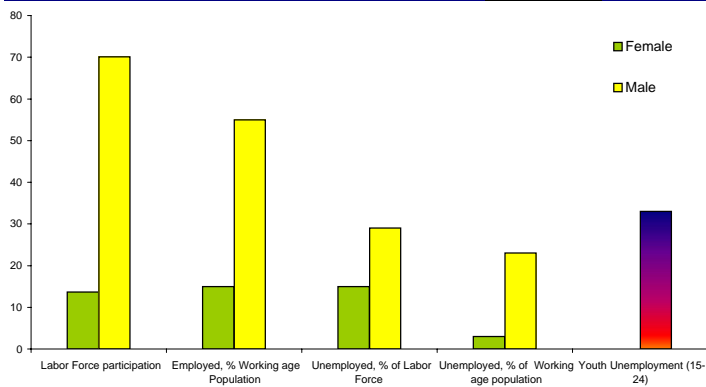

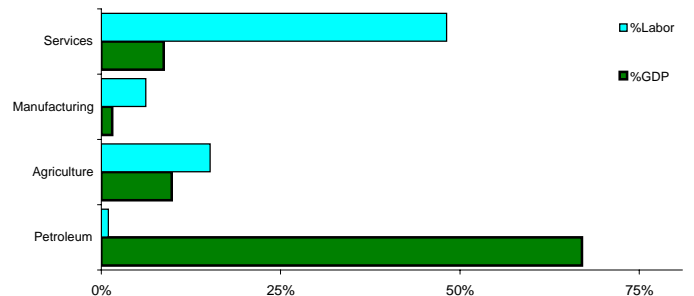
Reported civilian deaths as a result of acts of war and violence<sup>3</sup>



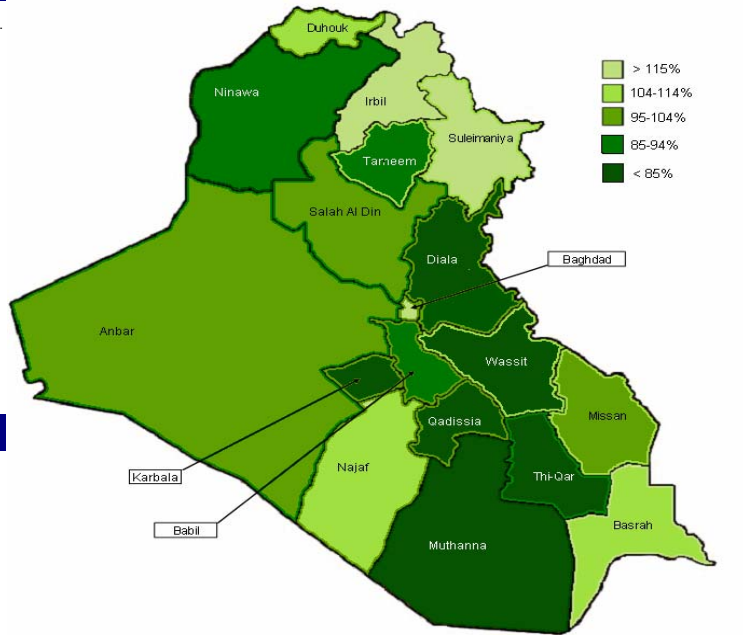
Labor Force and Unemployment 2004e (percent)<sup>2</sup>

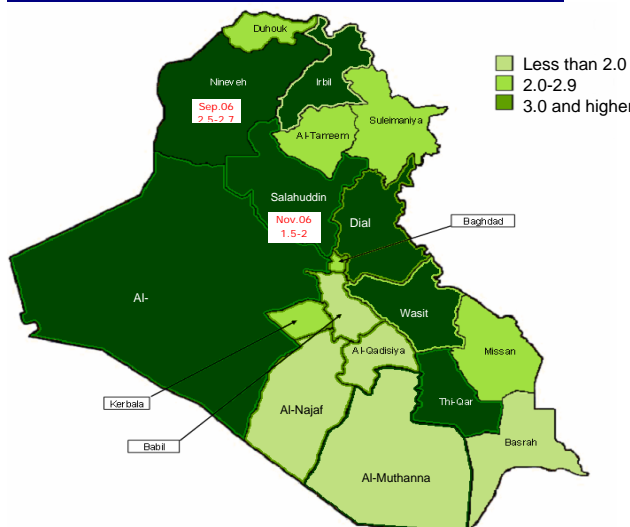

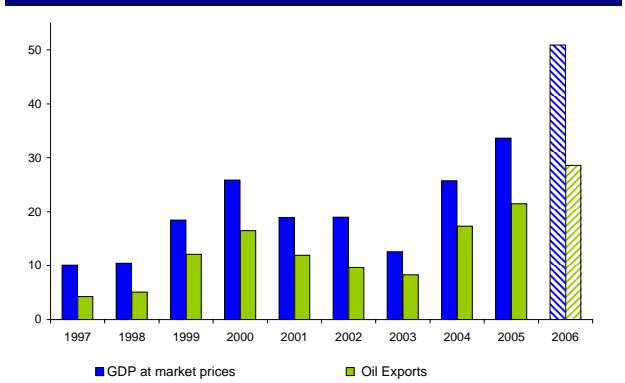

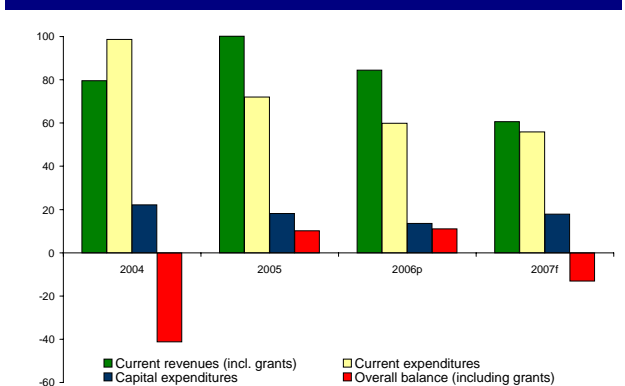
Gasoline: ratio of black market price to official price, March 2006<sup>5</sup>



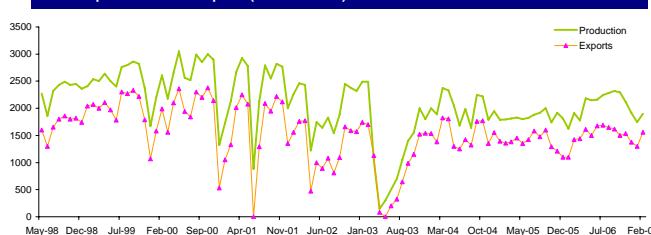
Nominal GDP and crude oil exports (US\$ billion)



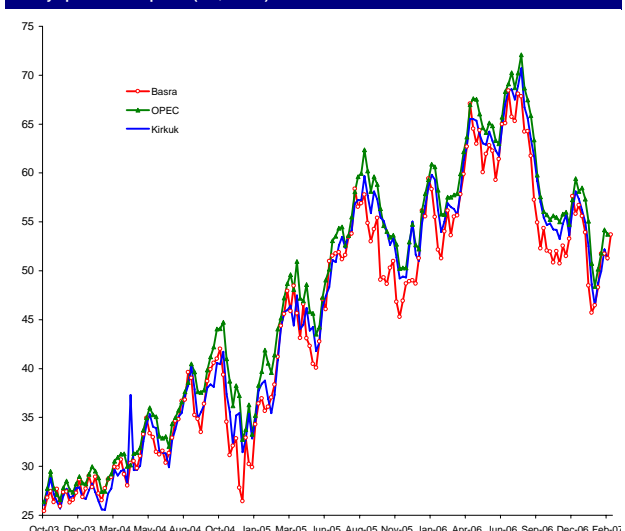
Public finances (percent of GDP)



Crude oil production and exports (thousand b/d)<sup>4</sup>

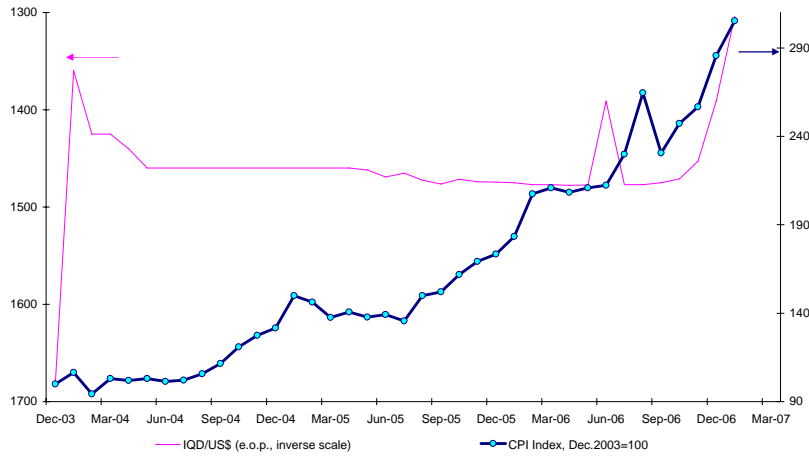


Weekly spot crude oil prices (US\$/barrel)<sup>6</sup>

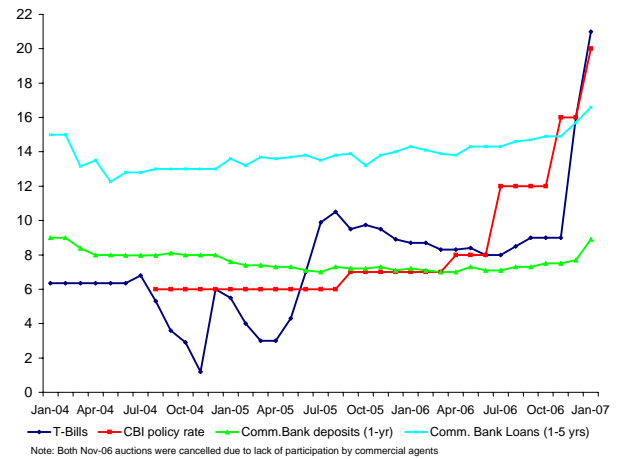

Exchange rate and consumer price index<sup>1</sup>

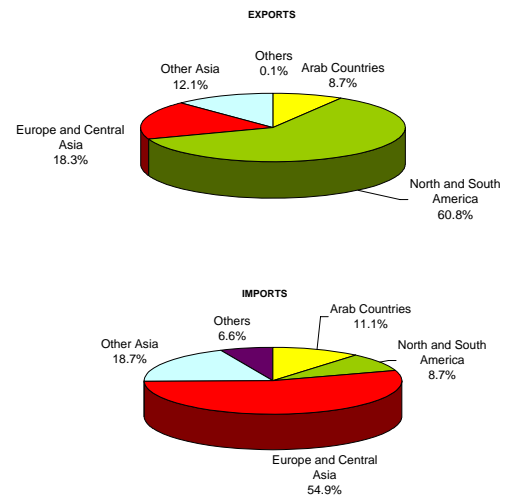

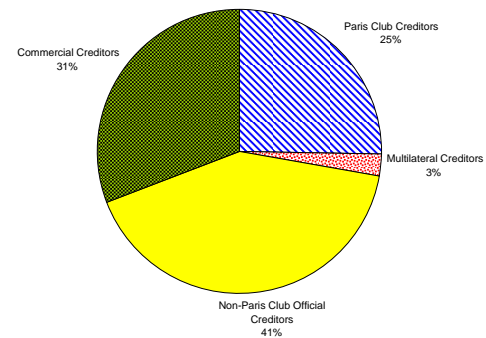

Geographical composition of merchandise trade, 2004

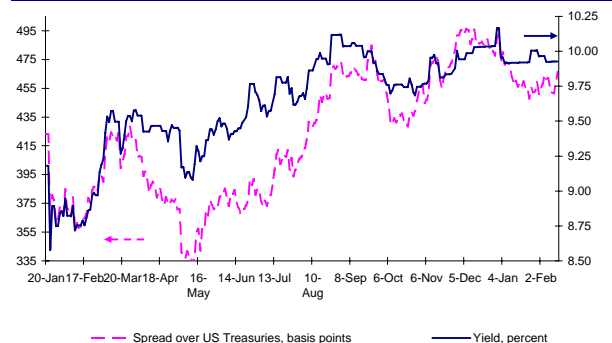
