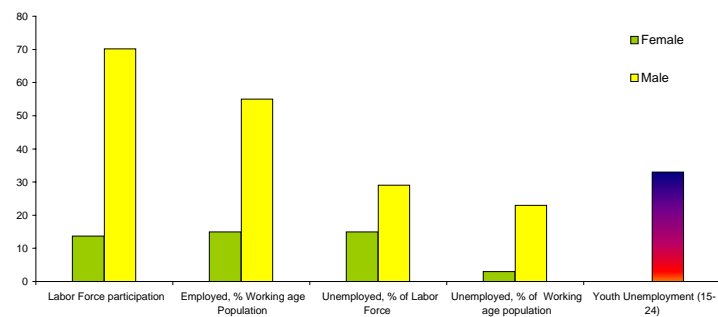

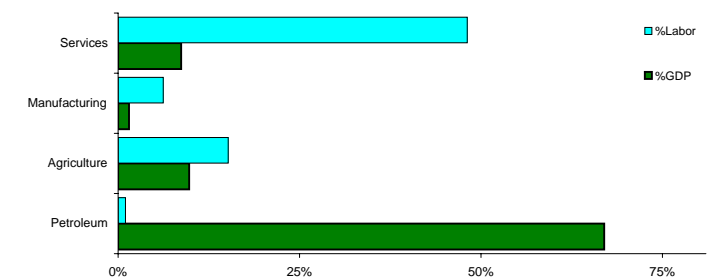

Labor Force and Unemployment 2004e (percent)⁴

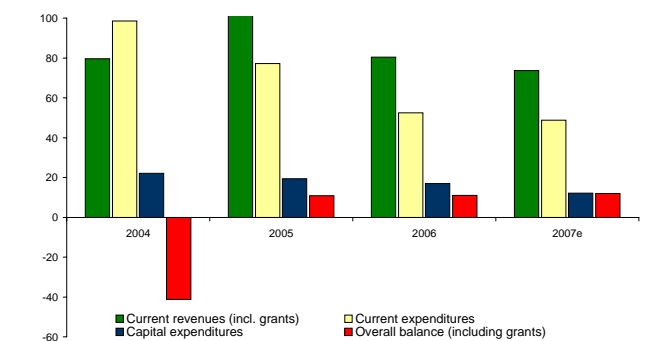


Employment and structure of GDP by sector, 2004

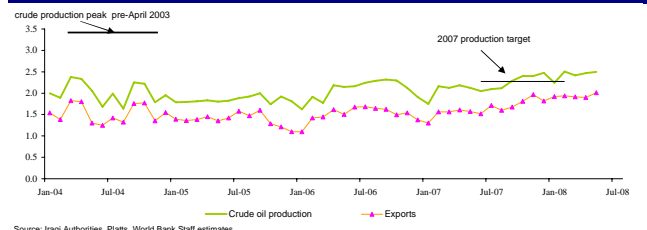

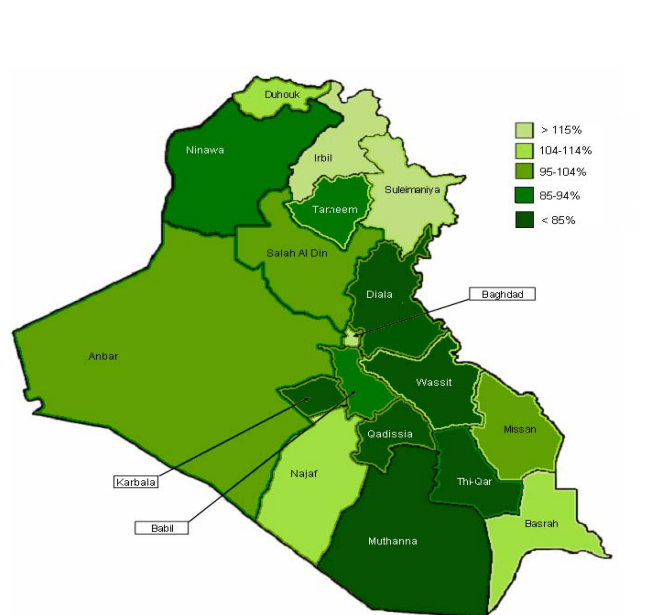
Public Finances (percent of GDP)



Crude Oil Production and Exports: January 2004- May 2008 (in mbpd)



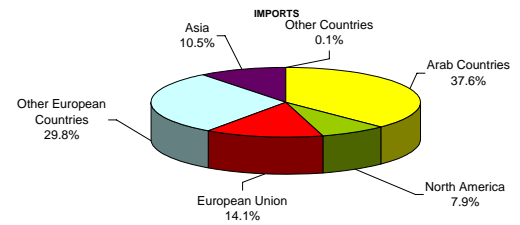
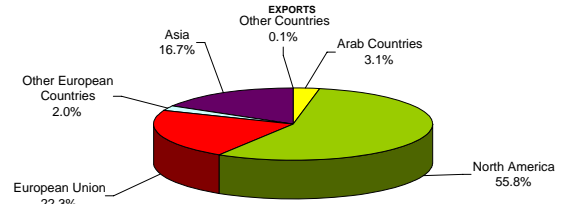
Regional income levels in Iraq in 2005

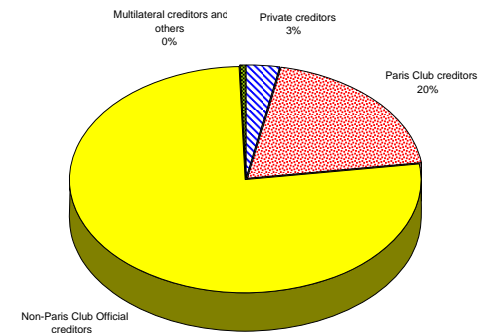
Geographical composition of merchandise trade, 2006



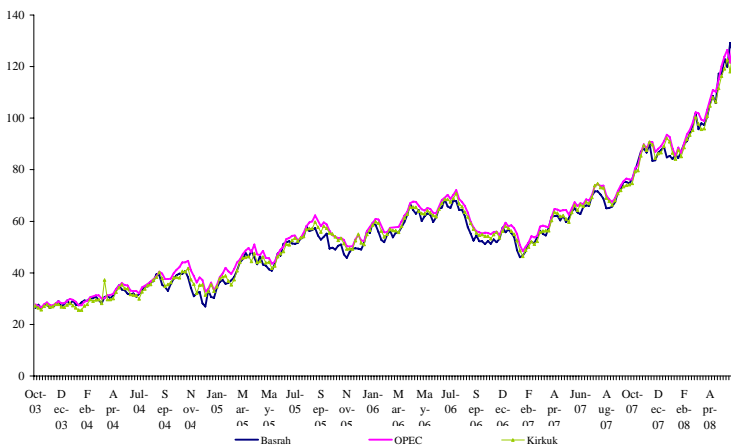
