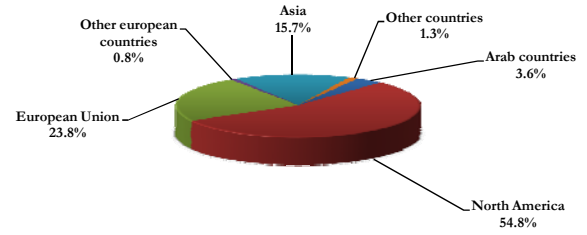

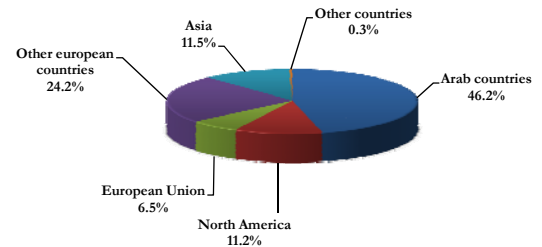

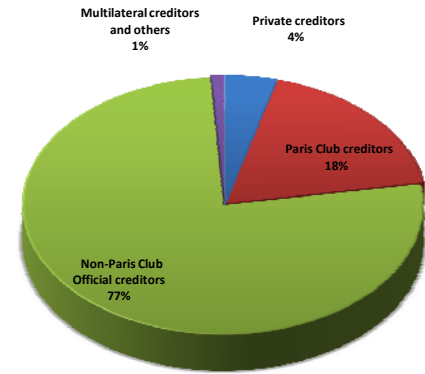

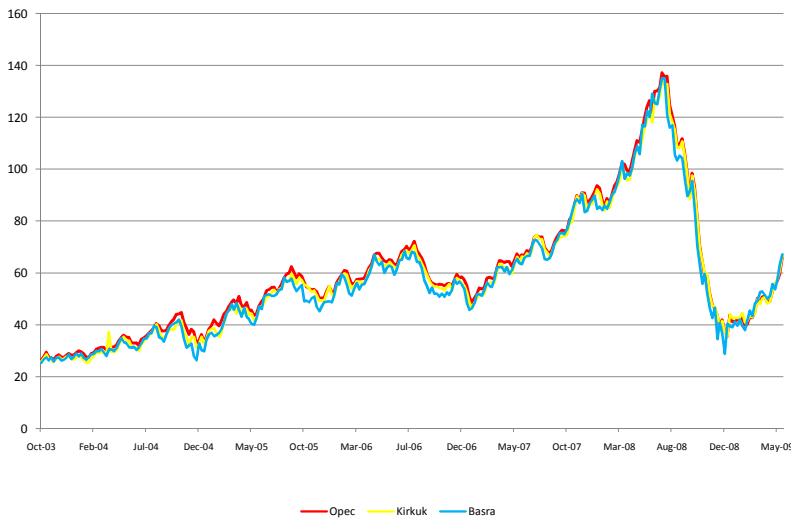

External public debt, December 31, 2007, (in percent of total)

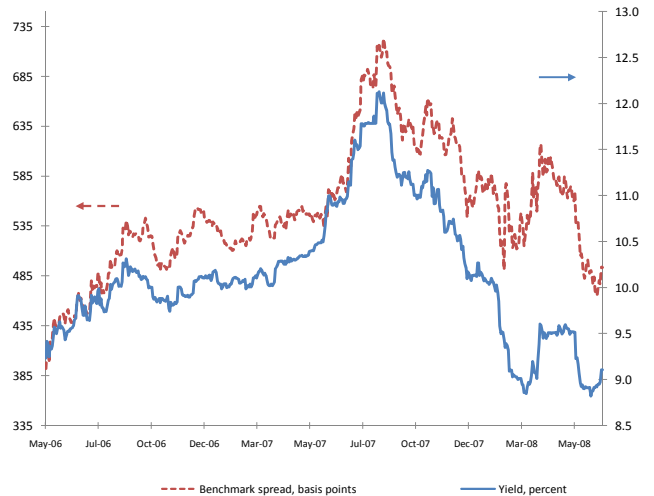
