

2010 World Programme on Population and Housing Censuses **Progress Report January to December 2006**

A. SUMMARY

Over the period January to December 2006 the United Nations Statistics Division (UNSD), under the guidance of the Statistical Commission, played a key role in coordinating the 2010 World Programme of Population and Housing Censuses. During this period, the programme's focus has been on finalizing the revised set of the Principles and Recommendations for Population and Housing Censuses. In line with the programme's objectives, the participation of developing countries in this revision work has been actively encouraged, ensuring that the revisions include a wide array of perspectives from both developed and developing countries. This has enhanced a sense of involvement among the developing countries. In the context, UNSD organized two expert group meetings. The first focused on principles and recommendations for housing censuses, held in New York 5-8 June 2006. It finalized the draft of the housing part of the *Principles and Recommendations for Population and Housing Censuses*. The second was held in New York, 10-14 July 2006. It was attended by over 50 participants and it discussed in detailed the final draft of the new set of international standards for population and housing censuses. At the end of this process of reviewing these standards for the 2010 Round of Population and Housing Censuses, the Drafting Group of the Expert Group submitted the version of *Principles and Recommendations for Population and Housing Censuses, Revision 2*, to the United Nations Statistical Commission for adoption. The Commission adopted the revised set on its 38th Session, 27 February – 2 March 2007, and invited all national statistical authorities to ensure their full implementation.

Following the finalization of the draft of the revised *Principles and Recommendations for Population and Housing Censuses*, UNSD maintained the momentum by organizing and conducted two workshops on the 2010 World Programme on Population and Housing Censuses that covered three major issues: 1) ensuring that all the national statistical authorities are fully briefed regarding the changes in the revised set of principles and recommendations for population and housing censuses; 2) assessing the major challenges faced by national authorities in conducting censuses in the 2010 round, and 3) evaluating the process of regional cooperation and support for census taking. The first workshop was held in Maputo, Mozambique for the English-speaking African countries, from 30 October – 3 November 2006, and the second in Bamako, Mali, for French-speaking African countries from 5-9 November 2006. Both workshops were attended by over 100 participants from 47 countries.

In the context of developing regional outlook in implementing *Principles and Recommendations for Population and Housing Censuses*, UNSD initiated a process for developing an African Addendum to the current set that would address issues of topics and harmonization relevant to the region. This initiative was endorsed by the Second African Symposium on Statistical Development, held in Kigali, Rwanda 15-19 January 2007.

B. EXPECTED ACCOMPLISHMENTS FOR 2006

As the objectives of the 2010 Census World Programme are for the whole duration of the programme (2005-2014) the specific expected accomplishments for 2006 are as follows (a Logical Framework can be found in Annex 1):

- EA1** Finalization of the draft United Nations *Principles and Recommendations for Population and Housing Censuses*;
- EA2** Increased understanding, by member states, of the revised *Principles and Recommendations for Population and Housing Censuses* and the 2010 Round of Population and Housing Censuses; and
- EA3** Establishment of regional initiatives for developing joint projects in planning and conducting population and housing censuses including data processing and disseminating of census results.

C. REVIEW OF IMPACT AND ACTIVITIES

Expected Accomplishment 1 (EA1)	Finalization of the draft United Nations <i>Principles and Recommendations for Population and Housing Censuses</i>
Results/Impact achieved for EA1	Two expert group meetings were organized and conducted by UNSD in the process of revising the <i>Principles and Recommendations for Population and Housing Censuses</i> , in June and July 2006. Based on the conclusions and recommendations of these meetings, UNSD and the Drafting Group finalized the draft set of recommendations. This set was submitted to the United Nations Statistical Commission that adopted it on its 38 th Session, 27 February – 2 March 2007. Mention should be made that the Africa Symposium, attended by representatives from 44 countries, which was partly supported by the project and active involvement of UNSD, came up with an African perspective in the review and updating of the <i>Principles & Recommendations of Population and housing censuses</i> .
Activities related to EA1	<p><u>United Nations Expert Group Meeting on Housing Censuses (UNHQ, New York, 5-8 June 2006) (Activity A4)</u>: The meeting: (a) discussed, in detail, proposed changes to the text of the current <i>Principles and Recommendations for Population and Housing Censuses</i>, (b) identified and elaborated on issues that are not adequately covered in the current version of the <i>Principles and Recommendations on housing censuses</i>, and (c) adopted the draft text of the housing census recommendations for submission to the Expert Group Meeting to be held in July 2006.</p> <p><u>United Nations Expert Group Meeting on the 2010 World Programme of Population and Housing Censuses (UNHQ, New York, 10-14 July 2006) (Activity A8)</u>: The purpose of the expert group meeting was to review and finalize the draft <i>Principles and Recommendations for Population and Housing Censuses, Revision 2</i>, before its submission to the Statistical Commission in 2007 for consideration and adoption.</p>

	<p>The review focused on all the three parts of the draft census recommendations, namely: Operational Aspects of Population and Housing Censuses; Topics for Population and Housing Censuses; and Census Products and Data Utilization, including recommended tabulations. The Expert Group, in its report, adopted conclusions and recommendations regarding the text of the <i>Principles and Recommendations for Population and Housing Censuses</i> and the process of its finalization by the Drafting Group and UNSD. The report highlights the work of over 100 subject-matter specialist from all over the work whose contribution has been embedded in the draft discussed by the Expert Group.</p> <p><u>2010 World Programme on PHC Website (Activity A6):</u> The maintenance and development of website has continued over the period under consideration. The website facilitated efficient and cost effective communication between national experts and other officials involved in the review and updating of the <i>Principles and Recommendation for Population and Housing Censuses</i>.</p>
<p>Expected Accomplishment 2 (EA2)</p>	<p>Increased understanding by representatives of member states of the revised <i>Principles and Recommendations for Population and Housing Censuses (P&R)</i> and the 2010 Round of Population and Housing Censuses</p>
<p>Results/Impact achieved for EA2</p>	<p>The African Census Symposium came up with the African perspectives of the Principles and Recommendation for Population Censuses which will be an input into the final review of the above. In addition it came up with a report on the lessons learnt from the 2000 round of censuses in Africa, including best practices. The Third Seminar on Alternative Methods for Population and Housing Censuses, Latin America discussed in detail the alternative census approaches including with respect to essential features of a census. Countries reviewed preparatory activities for some countries intending to adopt alternative designs. The seminar outlined, for each alternative approach, the prerequisites for its successful implementation. In this way participating countries grasped the best practices to adhere to in adopting alternative census methods. A Pacific Regional Census Planning workshop in which developed a standard questionnaire for that Region as well as agreeing on standard concepts compatible with P&R in areas including economic activity. The Work Session on Data Dissemination was received very well by the over twenty-four country participants that attended; and so was the support provided to specific countries in the planning for upcoming censuses. This will constitute a useful material for the edition of the new handbook on census dissemination. Two training workshops covered all of Africa and introduced the revised United Nations <i>Principles and Recommendations for Population and Housing Censuses</i> and their implementation. 88% if participants in these workshops reported that they learned something new at the workshops.</p>
<p>Activities related to EA2</p>	<p><u>2006 Africa Symposium on Statistical Development: the 2010 Round of Population and Housing Censuses (Cape Town, South Africa, 30 January – 2 February 2006) (Activity A1):</u> Attended by</p>

	<p>representatives of 43 African countries, the symposium dealt with the key issues and challenges for African national statistical systems focusing on the 2010 round Population and Housing Censuses and inputs into the revision of the Principles and Recommendations of Population and Housing censuses. It also provided a forum for continent wide presentation of best practices and exchanges of ideas.</p>
	<p><u>Working Session on Emerging Trends and Best Practices in Data Dissemination (New York, 3 March 2006) (Activity A2)</u>: Organized by UNSD in collaboration with the Swedish International Development Cooperation Agency (SIDA) and the Gapminder Foundation, the seminar dealt with the emerging trends in data dissemination policies and practices, approaches, including new methods of releasing census data.</p>
	<p><u>Third Seminar on Alternative Methods for Population and Housing Censuses (Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, 29-31 May 2006) (Activity A3)</u>: The seminar dealt with alternative methods to traditional population and housing censuses which aim at decreasing the cost of gathering data whilst not jeopardizing the quality of the data. The seminar was organized by the <i>Instituto Brasileiro de Geografia y Estatística (IBGE)</i> and the <i>Instituto Nacional de Estadística, Geografía e Informática (INEGI)</i> of Mexico. The meeting was attended by heads of national statistical offices and census experts from Latin American countries.</p>
	<p><u>Advisory Missions (Activity A5)</u>: A number of advisory mission were completed by UNSD staff to provided support national census initiatives in Asia, and regional initiatives in Asia, the Pacific and the ESCWA Regions. In addition, staff attended international meetings where census topics were dealt with.</p>
	<p><u>Inter-Regional Adviser on Population and Housing Census (Activity A7)</u>: The Inter-Regional Adviser on Population and Housing Census continued to provide technical assistance in the areas of: management of population and housing operations, planning census activities and cost-effective introduction of new technologies to census operations. During the period the adviser provided technical advice to member states, participated in regional meetings on census planning and management and provided advice on the quality of work performed in a national census project. In addition the adviser contributed to the development of revisions to the <i>Principles and Recommendations</i> and shared them with representative of countries workshops. The adviser is a member of the Management Group for Population Census Monitoring in Kosovo and continued liaison with UNFPA country office in Afghanistan on country census issues.</p>
	<p><u>ASEAN Meeting on the 2010 Round of Population and Housing Censuses (Siem Reap, Cambodia, 31 July – 2 August 2006) (Activity A13)</u>: At the meeting, the revised United Nations Principles and Recommendations for Population and Housing Censuses were introduced to ASEAN countries. Specifically, details of the new and revised international standards relating to conducting a population and housing census were presented and the process of selection of</p>

	<p>census topics and relevant questions for participating countries planning their censuses and for producing internationally required outputs was critically reviewed. In addition, national preparations to conduct a census as per United Nations recommendations were discussed, as well as ways of instituting and fostering regional cooperation in ASEAN countries in conducting population and housing censuses.</p>
	<p><u>United Nations Workshop on the 2010 World Programme on Population and Housing Censuses (Maputo, Mozambique, 30 October – 2 November 2006) (Activity A9):</u> The purpose of the workshop is to introduce the revised United Nations <i>Principles and Recommendations for Population and Housing Censuses</i> and their implementation, specifically to (1) present in detail the new and revised international standards related to conducting a population and housing census; (2) critically review the process of selection of census topics and relevant questions for participating countries planning their censuses and for producing internationally required outputs; (3) to discuss national plans and preparatory activities of conducting a census as per United Nations recommendations; and (4) identify components of the population and housing censuses that are in need of strengthening. This is to allow for the development of a comprehensive support system within the framework of the 2010 World Population and Housing Census Programme. At the end of the workshop, the participants adopted a set of conclusions and recommendations, such as the necessity to follow the United Nations principles and recommendations for population and housing censuses; the need for training in GPS and GIS and their use for census-taking; supported the output oriented approach of the revised set of recommendations and the core topics and recommended tabulations; concluded that the next round of censuses represents a specific challenge given the need for ensuring resources on time and catching up with development in technologies; and outlined the crucial impact of regional cooperation in exchange of knowledge and experiences.</p>
	<p><u>United Nations Workshop on the 2010 World Programme on Population and Housing Censuses (Bamako, Mali, 6 – 9 November 2006) (Activity A10):</u> The purpose of the workshop is to introduce the revised United Nations <i>Principles and Recommendations for Population and Housing Censuses</i> and their implementation, specifically to (1) present in detail the new and revised international standards related to conducting a population and housing census; (2) critically review the process of selection of census topics and relevant questions for participating countries planning their censuses and for producing internationally required outputs; (3) to discuss national plans and preparatory activities of conducting a census as per United Nations recommendations; and (4) identify components of the population and housing censuses that are, at the national level, that are likely to pose problems/constraints and are in need of strengthening. This is to allow for the development of a comprehensive support system within the framework of the 2010 World Population and Housing Census Programme. At the end of the workshop, participants adopted a set of conclusions and</p>

	<p>recommendations, such as the importance of implementation of principles and recommendations, especially from the point of view of regional comparisons; called upon UNSD to ensure a consistent production of guidelines and training in areas such as GIS, scanning, dissemination and analysis of census results; noted that some concepts in the revised set of principles and recommendations request additional elaboration, such as "intention to reside" as opposed to actual residence; outlined the need for governments to be fully supportive of the census taking and to take the lead responsibility for its success; requested the improvement of regional coordination.</p>
	<p><u>Development of guidance materials (Activity A11):</u> The outline for the handbook on census data dissemination was prepared and the process of identifying the consultant for preparing a draft was initiated. Also, the outline for the handbook on census documentation was initiated.</p>
	<p><u>Validation of UNSD population and housing census data (Activity A12):</u> In order to better identify which countries need the most support in the World Programme all records pertaining to the population and housing censuses currently in the Demographic Yearbook collection will be validated. This will identify the consistency, quality and accuracy of country data, and allow the technical support provided to countries in latter years of the 2010 World Programme to be better targeted. The process involved 31 different set of records or "tables" as they are called and the period covered was from 1948 till present. The procedures were devised so that each table should be subjected to a six-step checking process. Due to the complexity of the task, not completely envisaged at the beginning of the project, 17 of the tables were subjected to some or all of the steps of the checking process, which leaves 14 tables that need to be addressed in the same manner. The project revealed a number of data that are not included in the current databases for various reasons, a number of errors that were not corrected especially in terms of coding and validity and provided an opportunity to ensure that data are checked and stored for use in analyzing national capacity to produce and disseminate census results.</p>
	<p><u>Study Tour Visit under the 2010 World Programme on Population and Housing Censuses from Ethiopian NSO to Thai NSO (Bangkok, Thailand, 30 October - 1 November 2006) (Activity A14):</u> Four officials from the Ethiopian national statistical office undertook a three day study visit to the Thai national statistical office. The visit provided the Ethiopian officials practical knowledge from their peers on the planning, conducting, processing and dissemination of population and housing census. Since Thailand has roughly the same population size as Ethiopia with a long and sound record in population and housing censuses, the study visit benefited the Ethiopian NSO greatly in its preparatory activities for the 2007 Census of Ethiopia. The main topics covered included: population and housing Census operation, sample surveys and methodologies applied, utilization of GIS for data dissemination, ICT development and Data capturing techniques, and</p>

	<p>utilization of scanning technology for data capturing in population and housing census enumeration.</p>
	<p><u>Working Session on the 2010 Round of Population and Housing Censuses for Mercosur Countries (Foz do Iguazu, Brazil, 6-10 November 2006) (Activity A15):</u> Working session of the Joint Project of MERCOSUR, Bolivia and Chile for the planning of the 2010 Round of Population and Housing Censuses. The overall purpose of the working session was to continue with the horizontal collaboration between MERCOSUR countries (Common Market of the South Cone), Bolivia and Chile towards improving the reliability and comparability of data to be generated from the 2010 round of censuses. During the working session participants: (a) reviewed the changes to United Nations <i>Principles and Recommendations for Population and Housing Censuses</i>; (d) conducted a joint pilot test in Argentina, Paraguay and Brazil of some of the common contest to be included in the census questionnaires, particularly the battery of questions on disability and human functioning proposed by the Washington Group for inclusion in population and housing censuses; and (c) evaluated the operational and content results of the pilot test. The session identified some common cognitive problems; highlighted some operational issues; and agreed to complete the evaluation through analysis of the data collected during the pilot test; as well as inform the Washington Group of the results for the Latin American countries and; propose a set of revisions to improve the quality of the disability questions for inclusion in population and housing censuses. Participants also agreed to continue their activities towards the harmonization of concepts of the common census variables for the dissemination of micro-data. The meeting was attended by representatives from Argentina, Bolivia, Brazil, Chile, Colombia, Ecuador (observer), Mexico (observer), Paraguay, Peru, Uruguay and Venezuela (observer).</p>
	<p><u>14th Meeting of the Regional Census Coordinating Committee of CARICOM (Port of Spain, Trinidad and Tobago, 9-10 November 2006) (Activity A16):</u> At the meeting participants discussed preliminary plans for the conduct of the Population and Housing Censuses (PHC) in the 2010 round; shared experiences in the conduct of the 2000 round with particular references to specific aspects such as the mapping phase, training of enumerators, data capture and processing etc. and initiated the development of a 'blueprint' for the undertaking of PHCs for the 2010 round in the region. The conclusions have expressed the need to organize workshops on topics such as census management, census geo-coding and GIS, census processing and analysis; and effective dissemination strategies. In this connection, bilateral technical advisory missions could be supported. Technical assistance in gender statistics should therefore to be provided.</p>
	<p><u>Measuring International Migration: Concepts and Methods (New York, 4-7 December 2006) (Activity A17):</u> The meeting reviewed country practices in collecting statistics on international migration and identified various complexities and difficulties in applying the current UN concepts and definitions on international migration statistics. The</p>

	<p>meeting covered country experiences in the collection, analysis and use of migration data from population censuses and noted that the 2010 round offered an opportunity to collect more harmonized international migration data on migrant stock. It proposed that UNSD and the regional commissions provide technical guidance on this topic for the 2010 round of population censuses.</p>
	<p><u>Inter-Agency and Expert Group Meeting on Gender Statistics, New York, 12-14 December 2006 (Activity A18)</u>: The meeting promoted collaboration among stakeholders and enhanced the effectiveness of gender statistics programmes. The meeting reviewed the achievements of international and national gender statistics programmes and outlined a strategy to further improve the availability, quality and use of gender statistics at the country level. Specific recommended tabulations has been included in the Principles and Recommendations for population and housing censuses and specific monitoring on how countries integrate gender data in censuses will be undertake.</p>
	<p><u>Production of Promotional Materials (Activity A19)</u>: Posters of a world map and a table depicting which countries conducted (and did not conduct) a census in the 200 round of population and housing census were produced to use in advocacy of the 2010 round. The posters were subsequently distributed to national statistical offices and to the participants of the Second African Symposium on Statistical Development, Kigali, Rwanda, 15-19 January 2007.</p>

Results/Impact achieved for EA3	<p>A number of regional initiatives where established during the period in Africa (first meeting of all heads of African NSO with a focus on 2010 Census Round) Latin America and the Pacific. Comments on the results of these Meetings are shown under EA2 results. The continued work by the Inter-Regional Adviser towards Regional and inter-Regional cooperation ensures that work in two countries/areas (Afghanistan, Kosovo) emerging from difficult circumstances will be based on the concepts and procedures described in the updated <i>Principles and Recommendations</i>.</p>
