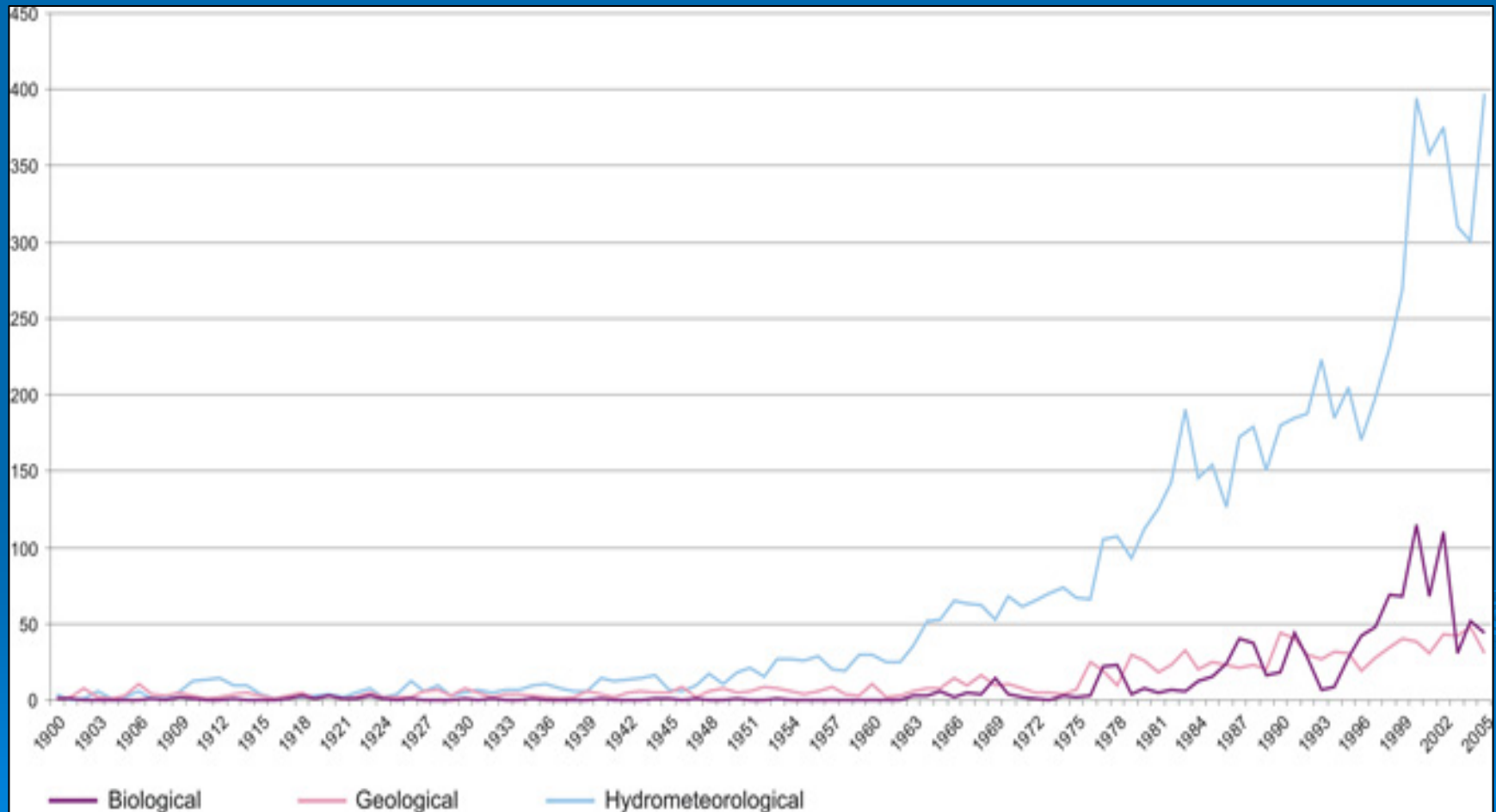

# Growing Impact and Cost

- Over 1997-2006, number of deaths doubled from 600,000 to 1.2 million
- 1.6 billion directly affected (1984-93) to 2.6 billion (1994-2003)
- Disaster costs 15 times higher between 1990-1999 (\$652 b) than between 1950-1959 (\$38 b)
- Disasters could cost \$300 b/yr by 2050

# Who is Most Vulnerable?

- Over 95% of deaths occur in developing countries
  - Losses are up to 20 times greater as a percentage of GDP
  - Poor households and communities tend to be the hardest hit

# What does all of this mean?

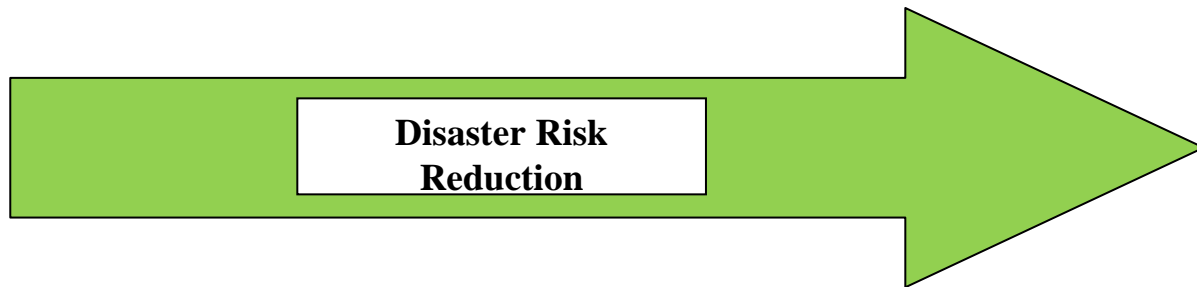
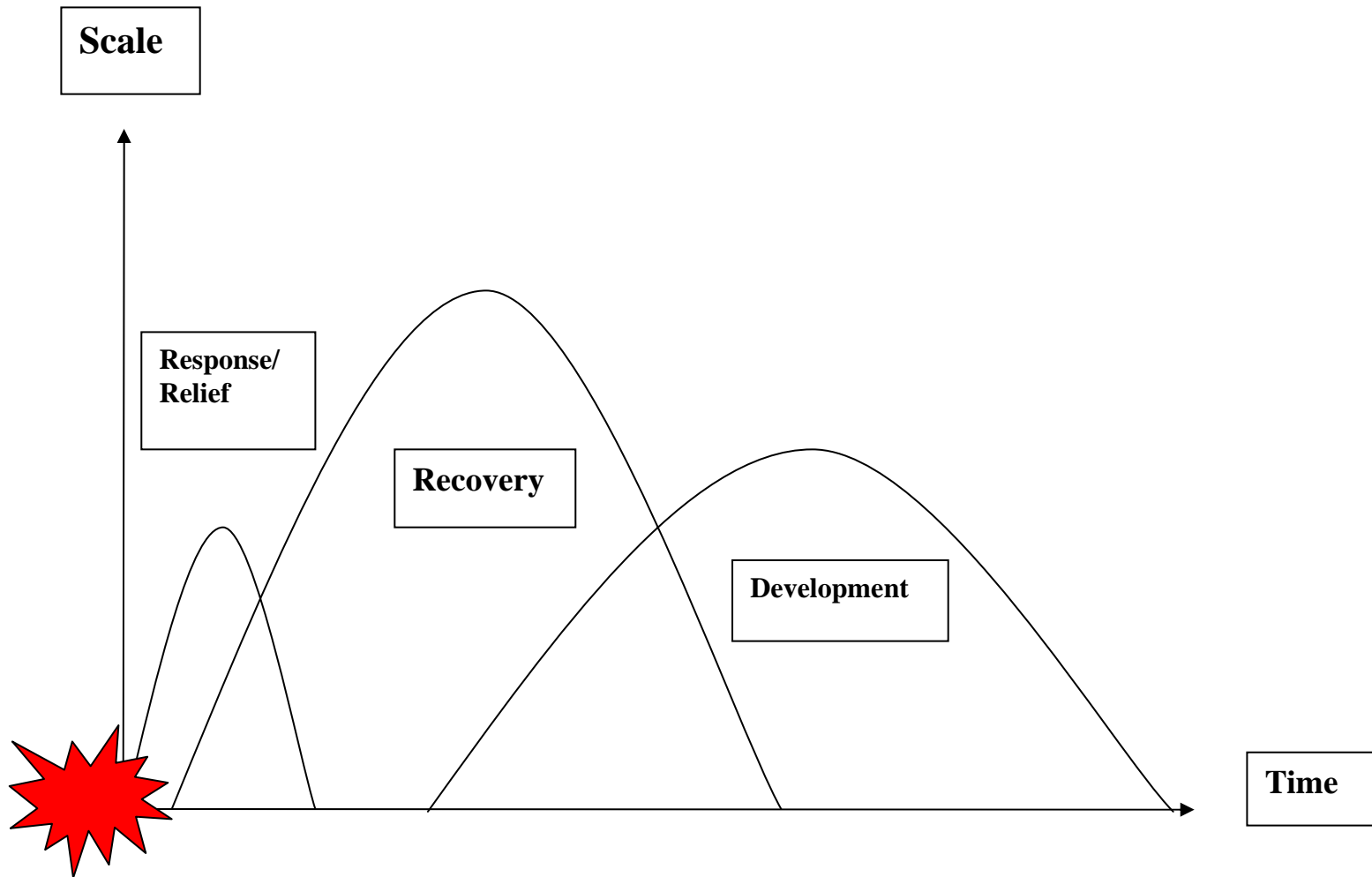
- Capacity needs to be built of poor and vulnerable communities and local governments to reduce risks and cope with impacts of disaster
